Employment in Corvallis MSA (Benton County): September 2020

Benton County's Unemployment Rate Declines to 5.6 Percent

Benton County's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 5.6 percent in September, down from its revised rate of 6.1 percent in August. Oregon's statewide unemployment rate in September was 8.0 percent, down from its revised August rate of 8.5 percent.

Benton County's employment gains in September were larger than normal; total nonfarm employment increased 1,620 jobs, when an employment increase of 890 jobs would be expected. As a result, seasonally adjusted employment increased 730 jobs, or 1.9 percent, between August and September. Seasonally adjusted total nonfarm employment remains 10.7 percent below the level in February, down 4,720 jobs after sharp job losses in the spring.

The private sector was a mix of industries gaining and losing employment. Leisure and hospitality and professional and business services each shed 30 jobs in September. Mining, logging, and construction; durable goods manufacturing; and trade, transportation, and utilities each reported an employment decline of 10 in September.

Employment gains occurred in private education and health services and other services, which added 70 jobs and 20 jobs, respectively, in September.

Leisure and hospitality has shown the largest employment decline in recent months. Despite adding 30 jobs in September the sector's employment is down 1,920 jobs, or 45 percent, compared with September 2019.

The public sector added 1,610 jobs in September, with the majority of those gains in local government education, which includes both local school districts and OSU.

Civilian labor force includes employed and unemployed individuals 16 years and older by place of residence.

Employed includes payroll employment, self-employed, unpaid family workers, domestics, agriculture, and labor disputants.

Unemployment rate is calculated by dividing unemployed by civilian labor force.

Nonfarm Payroll Employment: Official Oregon Series. Data are by place of work and cover full- and part-time employees who worked or received pay for the pay period that includes the 12th of the month. The data exclude the self-employed, volunteers, unpaid family workers, and domestics.

The Oregon Employment Department and the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) work cooperatively to develop and publish monthly payroll employment and labor force data for Oregon's metropolitan areas and counties. The estimates of monthly job gains and losses are based on a survey of businesses. The estimates of unemployment are based on a survey of households and other sources.

The Oregon Employment Department payroll employment estimates are revised quarterly using information from unemployment insurance tax records. All department publications use data from this *official Oregon series* unless noted.

The department also makes the BLS-produced nonfarm payroll employment series for metropolitan areas available. These are revised annually by BLS.
