Employment in Corvallis MSA (Benton County): July 2021

Benton County's Unemployment Rate Declines to 4.1%

Benton County's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 4.1% in July, down from its revised rate of 4.4% in June. Oregon's statewide unemployment rate in July was 5.2%, down from its revised June rate of 5.6%.

Benton County's employment losses in July were smaller than normal; total nonfarm employment decreased by 2,550 jobs, when an employment decrease of 3,560 jobs would be expected. As a result, seasonally adjusted employment increased 1,010 jobs, or 2.6%, between June and July. Seasonally adjusted total nonfarm employment remains 6.5% below the level in February 2020, down 2,820 jobs after sharp job losses in the spring of 2020.

Leisure and hospitality employment remains down 890 jobs or 20.3% from its pre-recession level in February 2020.

The private sector overall gained 80 jobs over the month. Leisure and hospitality added 100 jobs in July, up 2.9%. Manufacturing added 50 jobs in July, a gain of 1.7%.

The public sector shed 2,630 jobs in July. Local government education, which includes both local school districts and OSU, shed 2,640 jobs for summer break. State and federal government employment were both unchanged in July.

Civilian labor force includes employed and unemployed individuals 16 years and older by place of residence.
Employed includes payroll employment, self-employed, unpaid family workers, domestics, agriculture, and labor disputants.
Unemployment rate is calculated by dividing unemployed by civilian labor force.

Nonfarm Payroll Employment: Official Oregon Series. Data are by place of work and cover full- and part-time employees who worked or received pay for the pay period that includes the 12th of the month. The data exclude the self-employed, volunteers, unpaid family workers, and domestics.

The Oregon Employment Department and the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) work cooperatively to develop and publish monthly payroll employment and labor force data for Oregon's metropolitan areas and counties. The estimates of monthly job gains and losses are based on a survey of businesses. The estimates of unemployment are based on a survey of households and other sources.

The Oregon Employment Department payroll employment estimates are revised quarterly using information from unemployment insurance tax records. All department publications use data from this *official Oregon series* unless noted.

The department also makes the BLS-produced nonfarm payroll employment series for metropolitan areas available. These are revised annually by BLS.
