Employment in Lane County (Eugene MSA)

Lane County Employers Add 200 Jobs in June

Lane County's payroll employment increased a seasonally adjusted 200 jobs in June after increases of 600 in May and 200 in April. The county has regained 84% of the jobs lost in March and April of 2020 at the onset of the COVID-19 crisis.

In the not seasonally adjusted private-sector industries in June, there were large gains in construction (300) and leisure and hospitality (200). There was a large loss in education and health services of 300.

Government gained 100 jobs in June due to a gain of 100 in local government.

When comparing June 2022 with June 2021, total nonfarm employment is up a seasonally adjusted 7,400 jobs, or 4.8%.

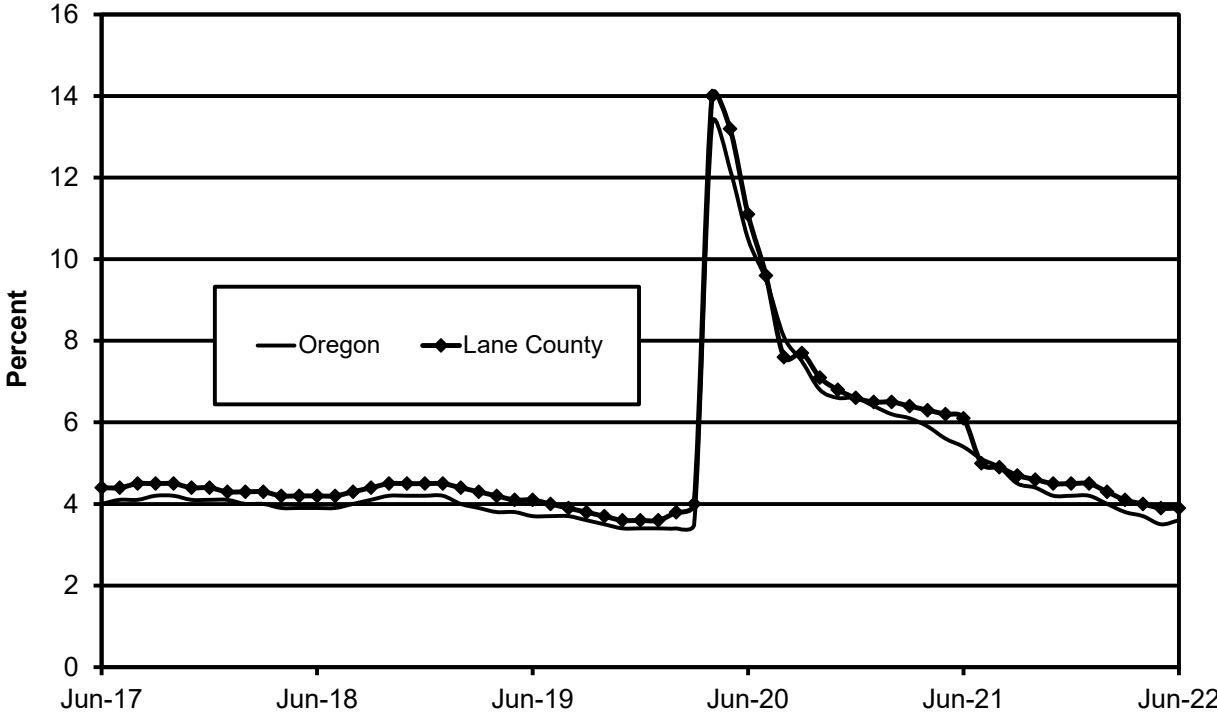
All major not seasonally adjusted industry sectors are up over the year, with leisure and hospitality (2,500), local education (1,400), financial activities (1,000), and manufacturing (700) adding the most.

Lane County's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was unchanged at 3.9% in June compared with a revised 3.9% in May. Lane County's record low rate was 3.6% in November 2019. The rate is down from 6.1% in June 2021. The Oregon seasonally adjusted June rate was 3.6% and the U.S. rate was 3.6% in June.

Civilian labor force includes employed and unemployed individuals 16 years and older by place of residence.

Employed includes payroll employment, self-employed, unpaid family workers, domestics, agriculture, and labor disputants.

Unemployment rate is calculated by dividing unemployed by civilian labor force.

Nonfarm Payroll Employment: Official Oregon Series. Data are by place of work and cover full- and part-time employees who worked or received pay for the pay period that includes the 12th of the month. The data exclude the self-employed, volunteers, unpaid family workers, and domestics.

The Oregon Employment Department and the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) work cooperatively to develop and publish monthly payroll employment and labor force data for Oregon's metropolitan areas and counties. The estimates of monthly job gains and losses are based on a survey of businesses. The estimates of unemployment are based on a survey of households and other sources.

The Oregon Employment Department payroll employment estimates are revised quarterly using information from unemployment insurance tax records. All department publications use data from this *official Oregon series* unless noted.

The department also makes the BLS-produced nonfarm payroll employment series for metropolitan areas available. These are revised annually by BLS.
