Employment in Lane County (Eugene MSA): April 2018

Lane County's Unemployment Remains Low at 4.2 Percent in April

Lane County's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was essentially unchanged at a low 4.2 percent in April compared with a revised 4.3 percent in March. It is the same as the April 2017 rate of 4.3 percent. Oregon's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 4.1 percent and the national rate was 3.9 percent in April.

Not seasonally adjusted total nonfarm employment increased by 400 jobs in April. Lane County gained 2,700 jobs since April 2017 for an over-the-year growth rate of 1.7 percent. Statewide, the over-the-year growth rate was 1.6 percent in April.

At the private-sector industry level, there were seasonal gains in construction (+100) and leisure and hospitality (+300). Elsewhere, there were relatively large gains in professional and business services (+400) and manufacturing (+200). There was a loss of 500 in education and health services.

Government dropped 200 in April from a loss in local education.

Over the year, the largest gains in the private sector were in private education and health services (+2,100), partly due to the reclassification of home health care workers; manufacturing (+600); construction (+500); and leisure and hospitality (+300). The only private-sector over-the-year loss occurred in information (-200).

Government lost 1,600 over the year largely due to the reclassification of home health care workers to private health care and social assistance.



Labor Force Status: Civilian labor force includes employed and unemployed individuals 16 years and older by place of residence. Employed includes nonfarm payroll employment, self-employed, unpaid family workers, domestics, agriculture, and labor disputants. Unemployment rate is calculated by dividing unemployed by civilian labor force.

Nonfarm Payroll Employment: Data are by place of work and cover full- and part-time employees who worked or received pay for the pay period that includes the 12th of the month. The data exclude the self-employed, volunteers, unpaid family workers, and domestics.



The Oregon Employment Department and the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) work cooperatively to develop and publish monthly payroll employment and labor force data for Oregon's metropolitan areas and counties. The estimates of monthly job gains and losses are based on a survey of businesses. The estimates of unemployment are based on a survey of households and other sources.

The Oregon Employment Department payroll employment estimates are revised quarterly using information from unemployment insurance tax records. All department publications use data from this *official Oregon series* unless noted.

The department also makes the BLS-produced nonfarm payroll employment series for metropolitan areas available. These are revised annually by BLS.
