Employment in Lincoln County: June 2021

Seasonally adjusted employment rose by 20 in June

Seasonally adjusted nonfarm payroll employment increased by 20 in June to 17,170 jobs. Seasonally adjusted figures compare expected changes with actual changes. A gain of 530 jobs was expected for the month, but the county's total nonfarm employment rose by 550. The private sector added 490 jobs, and government employment rose by 60. The leisure and hospitality sector added 280 jobs. Food manufacturing grew by 110 jobs as commercial fishing increased. Retail trade added 40 jobs. Other industries had smaller changes.

June's total nonfarm employment numbers show a gain of 1,180 jobs compared with one year before, an increase of 7.1%. The county lost 4,360 jobs in April 2020 as the pandemic hit, and it remains 1,800 jobs below its pre-pandemic employment of June 2019. Almost every major industry added jobs over the past year. Leisure and hospitality recovered 510 jobs from the year before. Retail trade regained 230 jobs, and financial activities added back 110 jobs.

Lincoln County's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 7.7% in June, essentially unchanged from 7.9% in May. It was 15.4% the year before. The statewide unemployment rate was 5.6% in June, and the national rate was 5.9%.

The estimates of monthly job gains and losses are based on a survey of businesses. The estimates of unemployment are based on a survey of households and other sources.

The Oregon Employment Department payroll employment estimates are revised quarterly using information from unemployment insurance tax records. All department publications use data from this *official Oregon series* unless noted.

The department also makes the BLS-produced nonfarm payroll employment series for metropolitan areas available. These are revised annually by BLS.
