





Employment in the Portland Metro Area: June 2019

The Portland metro area's unemployment rate was unchanged at 3.8 percent in June. Oregon's unemployment rate was 4.1 percent and the national rate was 3.7 percent. An estimated 51,800 Portland-area residents were unemployed in June; the same as a year earlier.

The region gained 300 jobs in June (seasonally adjusted) following a flat May. Professional and business services added more jobs than typical, largely in the employment services (temp help) sector. Leisure and hospitality also saw aboveaverage gains. Trade, transportation, and utilities declined by 300 jobs during a month that typically sees this sector adding more than 1,000 jobs. The wholesale trade and transportation components cut



jobs, while retail added about half the usual number of jobs.

Over the past year, nonfarm employment increased by 2.6 percent (30,900 jobs). Annual growth has held steady – at around 2.5 percent – since the beginning of the year. Construction remains the fastest-growing broad industry (5.9%) but has decelerated slightly. Growth has also moderated in trade, transportation, and utilities, with the wholesale and retail trade components now in the red. At the same time, growth has picked up in professional and business services and in leisure and hospitality.

The Oregon Employment Department will release the Portland metropolitan area's unemployment rate and employment survey data for July on Tuesday, August 20.

The Oregon Employment Department and the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) work cooperatively to develop and publish monthly payroll employment and labor force data for Oregon's metropolitan areas and counties. The estimates of monthly job gains and losses are based on a survey of businesses. The estimates of unemployment are based on a survey of households and other sources.

The Oregon Employment Department payroll employment estimates are revised quarterly using information from unemployment insurance tax records. All department publications use data from this *official Oregon series* unless noted.

The department also makes the BLS-produced nonfarm payroll employment series for metropolitan areas available. These are revised annually by BLS.

Civilian labor force includes employed and unemployed individuals 16 years and older by place of residence. Employed includes payroll employment, self-employed, unpaid family workers, domestics, agriculture, and labor disputants. Unemployment rate is calculated by dividing unemployed by civilian labor force.

Nonfarm Payroll Employment: Offical Oregon Series. Data are by place of w ork and cover full- and part-time employees w ho w orked or received pay for the pay period that includes the 12th of the month. The data exclude the self-employed, volunteers, unpaid family w orkers, and domestics.

The Portland-Vancouver-Hillsboro metropolitan area includes Clackamas, Columbia, Multnomah, Washington, and Yamhill counties in Oregon, and Clark and Skamania counties in Washington State.
