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## **Employment in South Coast: June 2022 Leisure and Hospitality Sector Shows Gains in June**

Coos County total payroll employment fell by 30 jobs in June. Leisure and hospitality (+80) and construction (+20) were the sectors with job gains over the month. Employment fell in professional and business services (-90); manufacturing (-30); and private educational and health services (-20). Government employment had a net decline of 30 jobs. Gains in state government (+20) and Indian tribal (+20) were offset by a loss of 70 jobs in local government education.

Coos County total payroll employment fell by 350 jobs over the past year. The largest drop was in professional and business services which lost 280 jobs. Private education and health services (-70); manufacturing (-50); mining and logging (-40); and transportation, warehousing, and utilities (-30) showed job losses since June 2021. Leisure and hospitality (+80); retail trade (+50); manufacturing (+30); and wholesale trade (+20) saw job increases over the year.

Curry County payroll employment grew by 140 jobs in June. Leisure and hospitality gained 70 jobs while smaller increases across a number of sectors contributed to the monthly increase. Government employment rose by 40 with gains in local (+20); state (+10); and federal government (+10).

Over the past year, Curry County payroll employment rose by 50 jobs. Gains were estimated in leisure and hospitality (+60); information (+10); and other services (+10). Job losses were posted in wood product manufacturing (-20); financial activities (-30); and health care (-20). Government employment slipped by 10 jobs over the year.

The Oregon Employment Department plans to release the July county and metropolitan area unemployment rates and employment survey data on Tuesday, Aug. 23<sup>rd</sup>, and the statewide unemployment rate and employment survey data for July on Wednesday, Aug. 17<sup>th</sup>.

The Oregon Employment Department and the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) work cooperatively to develop and publish monthly payroll employment and labor force data for Oregon's metropolitan areas and counties. The estimates of monthly job gains and losses are based on a survey of businesses. The estimates of unemployment are based on a survey of households and other sources.

The Oregon Employment Department payroll employment estimates are revised quarterly using information from unemployment insurance tax records. All department publications use data from this *official Oregon series* unless noted.

The department also makes the BLS-produced nonfarm payroll employment series for metropolitan areas available. These are revised annually by BLS.
