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## **Employment in Tillamook County: November 2018**

### **Employment Up by 70 Jobs more than Expected in November**

Seasonally adjusted nonfarm payroll employment jumped by 70 jobs in November to 9,190 jobs. Seasonally adjusted figures compare expected changes with actual changes. A loss of 140 jobs was expected for the month, but the county shed only 70. The private sector cut 80 jobs, and government employment rose by 10. Leisure and hospitality cut 80 jobs and food manufacturing trimmed 30. Other industries had smaller changes.

November's total nonfarm employment was 150 more than one year before, a gain of 1.7 percent. The private sector added 250 jobs, and government lost 100 jobs. Food manufacturing added 120 jobs over the year but professional and business services cut 50 jobs. Local government excluding education shed 50 jobs over the year. About 80 jobs were reclassified from state government to private-sector education and health services.

Tillamook County's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 4.5 percent in November, essentially unchanged from the previous month (4.4%) and the year before (4.3%). It also was slightly higher than the statewide rate (3.9%) and the national rate (3.7%).

Nonfarm Payroll Employment: Data are by place of work and cover full- and part-time employees who worked or received pay for the pay period that includes the 12th of the month. The data exclude the self-employed, volunteers, unpaid family workers, and domestics.

The Oregon Employment Department and the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) work cooperatively to develop and publish monthly payroll employment and labor force data for Oregon's metropolitan areas and counties. The estimates of monthly job gains and losses are based on a survey of businesses. The estimates of unemployment are based on a survey of households and other sources.

The Oregon Employment Department payroll employment estimates are revised quarterly using information from unemployment insurance tax records. All department publications use data from this *official Oregon series* unless noted.

The department also makes the BLS-produced nonfarm payroll employment series for metropolitan areas available. These are revised annually by BLS.
