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Employment in Tillamook County: December 2019

Seasonally adjusted employment slipped by 10 in December

Seasonally adjusted nonfarm payroll employment decreased by 10 in December to 9,560 jobs. Seasonally adjusted figures compare expected changes with actual changes. A loss of 150 was expected for the month, but the county lost 160 jobs. Private-sector employment decreased by 140 jobs, and government employment slid by 20. Leisure and hospitality eliminated 60 jobs over the month. Other industries had smaller changes.

December's total nonfarm employment was 40 more than one year before, a gain of 0.4 percent. The private sector shed 40 jobs over the year, and government gained 80 jobs. Local government education and grew by 40 jobs over the year. Professional and business services and retail trade each added 30 jobs. Food manufacturing lost 100 jobs over the year.

Tillamook County's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 3.8 percent in December. It was essentially unchanged from the previous month (4.0%) and lower than the year before (4.7%). It was about the same as the statewide rate (3.7%) and the national rate (3.5%).

Nonfarm Payroll Employment: Data are by place of work and cover full- and part-time employees who worked or received pay for the pay period that includes the 12th of the month. The data exclude the self-employed, volunteers, unpaid family workers, and domestics.

The Oregon Employment Department and the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) work cooperatively to develop and publish monthly payroll employment and labor force data for Oregon's metropolitan areas and counties. The estimates of monthly job gains and losses are based on a survey of businesses. The estimates of unemployment are based on a survey of households and other sources.

The Oregon Employment Department payroll employment estimates are revised quarterly using information from unemployment insurance tax records. All department publications use data from this *official Oregon series* unless noted.

The department also makes the BLS-produced nonfarm payroll employment series for metropolitan areas available. These are revised annually by BLS.
