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## **Employment in Tillamook County: November 2020**

### **Seasonally adjusted employment up 40 more than expected in November**

Seasonally adjusted nonfarm payroll employment rose by 40 in November to 8,700 jobs. Seasonally adjusted figures compare expected changes with actual changes. Employment was expected to drop by 140 jobs, but the county lost only 100. The private sector shed 90 jobs, and government employment was down 10. Leisure and hospitality cut 90 jobs. Other industries had smaller changes.

November's total nonfarm employment numbers show a loss of 830 jobs compared with one year before, a decrease of 8.8%. Nearly every major industry lost jobs over the year. Leisure and hospitality shed many of the jobs; the industry was down 250 jobs over the year, a drop of 17.0%.

Tillamook County's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate dropped from the previous month. It was 5.7% in November and 6.6% in October. It was 3.3% the year before. The statewide unemployment rate was 6.0% in November, and the national rate was 6.7%.

The estimates of monthly job gains and losses are based on a survey of businesses. The estimates of unemployment are based on a survey of households and other sources.

The Oregon Employment Department payroll employment estimates are revised quarterly using information from unemployment insurance tax records. All department publications use data from this *official Oregon series* unless noted.

The department also makes the BLS-produced nonfarm payroll employment series for metropolitan areas available. These are revised annually by BLS.
