Employment in Tillamook County: November 2021

Seasonally adjusted employment rose by 40 in November

Seasonally adjusted nonfarm payroll employment increased by 40 in November to 9,380 jobs. Seasonally adjusted figures compare expected changes with actual changes. Employment was expected to fall by 150 jobs, but the county lost only 110 jobs. The private sector shed 120 jobs, and government employment rose by 10. Leisure and hospitality cut 80 jobs. Local government added 30 jobs. Other industries had smaller changes.

November's total nonfarm employment numbers show a gain of 270 jobs compared with one year before, an increase of 3.0%. The county lost 1,370 jobs in April 2020 as the pandemic hit, and it remains 200 jobs below its pre-pandemic employment of November 2019. About half of the major industries gained jobs over the past year. Leisure and hospitality regained 130 jobs. Manufacturing added back 70 jobs, and retail trade grew by 60 jobs. Local government education regained 70 jobs over the year.

Tillamook County's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 4.8% in November, essentially unchanged from 5.2% in October. It was 6.9% the year before. The statewide unemployment rate was 4.2% in November, and the national rate was 4.2%.

Tillamook County's unadjusted unemployment rate was even lower (3.6%) in November. Every county in Oregon had an unadjusted unemployment rate under 5% in November and three-fourths of the counties had rates that were under 4%. The only comparable period in the last 20 years with such low unemployment rates across the state was in the fall of 2019.

Nonfarm Payroll Employment: Data are by place of work and cover full- and part-time employees who worked or received pay for the pay period that includes the 12th of the month. The data exclude the self-employed, volunteers, unpaid family workers, and domestics.

The Oregon Employment Department and the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) work cooperatively to develop and publish monthly payroll employment and labor force data for Oregon's metropolitan areas and counties. The estimates of monthly job gains and losses are based on a survey of businesses. The estimates of unemployment are based on a survey of households and other sources.

The Oregon Employment Department payroll employment estimates are revised quarterly using information from unemployment insurance tax records. All department publications use data from this *official Oregon series* unless noted.

The department also makes the BLS-produced nonfarm payroll employment series for metropolitan areas available. These are revised annually by BLS.
