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Employment in Yamhill County: June 2022

Yamhill County's Unemployment Rate Drops to 3.2%

Yamhill County's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 3.2% in June, down from its revised rate of 3.3% in May. Oregon's statewide unemployment rate in June was 3.6%, up from its revised May rate of 3.5%.

Yamhill County's employment losses in June were smaller than normal; total nonfarm employment decreased 440 jobs, when an employment decrease of 710 jobs would be expected. As a result, seasonally adjusted employment increased by 270 jobs between May and June. Employment is 0.6%, or 220 jobs, below the pre-pandemic level in February 2020.

The private sector shed 420 jobs in June. The largest losses were in private education and health services (-630 jobs, -8.0%) and professional and business services (-40 jobs, -1.8%).

Sectors adding the most employment in June were manufacturing (+120 jobs, +1.7%); retail trade (+40 jobs, +1.1%); and construction (+30 jobs, +1.4%).

Yamhill County's public sector shed 20 jobs in June. Local government and federal government employment both dropped 10. State government employment was unchanged in June.

Civilian labor force includes employed and unemployed individuals 16 years and older by place of residence.

Employed includes payroll employment, self-employed, unpaid family workers, domestics, agriculture, and labor disputants.

Unemployment rate is calculated by dividing unemployed by civilian labor force.

Nonfarm Payroll Employment: Data are by place of work and cover full- and part-time employees who worked or received pay for the pay period that includes the 12th of the month. The data exclude the self-employed, volunteers, unpaid family workers, and domestics.

The Oregon Employment Department and the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) work cooperatively to develop and publish monthly payroll employment and labor force data for Oregon's metropolitan areas and counties. The estimates of monthly job gains and losses are based on a survey of businesses. The estimates of unemployment are based on a survey of households and other sources.

The Oregon Employment Department payroll employment estimates are revised quarterly using information from unemployment insurance tax records. All department publications use data from this *official Oregon series* unless noted.

The department also makes the BLS-produced nonfarm payroll employment series for metropolitan areas available. These are revised annually by BLS.
