Employment in Yamhill County: June 2020

Yamhill County's Unemployment Rate Declines to 9.7 Percent

Yamhill County's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 9.7 percent in June, down from its revised rate of 13.2 percent in May. Oregon's statewide unemployment rate in June was 11.2 percent, down from its revised May rate of 14.3 percent.

Yamhill County's employment losses in June were smaller than normal; total nonfarm employment decreased 350 jobs, when an employment loss of 480 jobs would be expected. As a result, seasonally adjusted employment increased 130 jobs, or 0.4 percent between May and June. Employment remains 9.6 percent, or 3,390 jobs, below the level in February, after sharp job losses in March and April.

Manufacturing (-60 jobs, -0.9%) and private educational services (-570 jobs, -22.7%) were the two industries in the private sector showing employment declines in June.

Most private-sector industries added employment in June. Other services showed the sharpest increase, adding 100 jobs for a 10.4 percent increase over the month. Other services includes many businesses that offer personal services that were temporarily closed due to COVID-19. Leisure and hospitality employment grew 150 in June, a monthly gain of 5.5 percent. Retail trade employment grew 60 in June, a 1.8 percent increase.

Yamhill County's public sector shed 30 jobs in June, all within local government.

Civilian labor force includes employed and unemployed individuals 16 years and older by place of residence.

Employed includes payroll employment, self-employed, unpaid family workers, domestics, agriculture, and labor disputants.

Unemployment rate is calculated by dividing unemployed by civilian labor force.

Nonfarm Payroll Employment: Data are by place of work and cover full- and part-time employees who worked or received pay for the pay period that includes the 12th of the month. The data exclude the self-employed, volunteers, unpaid family workers, and domestics.

The Oregon Employment Department and the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) work cooperatively to develop and publish monthly payroll employment and labor force data for Oregon's metropolitan areas and counties. The estimates of monthly job gains and losses are based on a survey of businesses. The estimates of unemployment are based on a survey of households and other sources.

The Oregon Employment Department payroll employment estimates are revised quarterly using information from unemployment insurance tax records. All department publications use data from this *official Oregon series* unless noted.

The department also makes the BLS-produced nonfarm payroll employment series for metropolitan areas available. These are revised annually by BLS.
