Employment in Yamhill County: October 2020

Yamhill County's Unemployment Rate Declines to 6.0 Percent

Yamhill County's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 6.0 percent in October, down from its revised rate of 6.8 percent in September. Oregon's statewide unemployment rate in October was 6.9 percent, down from its revised September rate of 7.9 percent.

Yamhill County's employment gains in October were fairly normal; total nonfarm employment increased 300 jobs, when an employment gain of 300 jobs would be expected. As a result, seasonally adjusted employment was unchanged between September and October. Employment remains 8.9 percent, or 3,140 jobs, below the level in February, after sharp job losses in the spring.

Trade, transportation, and utilities (-40 jobs, -0.8%) and mining and logging (-10 jobs, -7.1%) were the two industries in the private sector showing employment declines in October.

The private-sector industry adding the most employment in October was manufacturing which gained 210 jobs or 3.3 percent. Private education added 130 jobs for a 4.0 percent increase over the month.

Yamhill County's public sector shed 10 jobs in October. Local government added 20 jobs in October while federal government shed 30 jobs.

The most recent month is preliminary, the prior month is revised. Prepared in cooperation with the U.S. Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics.

Civilian labor force includes employed and unemployed individuals 16 years and older by place of residence. Employed includes payroll employment, self-employed, unpaid family workers, domestics, agriculture, and labor disputants. Unemployment rate is calculated by dividing unemployed by civilian labor force.

Nonfarm Payroll Employment: Data are by place of work and cover full- and part-time employees who worked or received pay for the pay period that includes the 12th of the month. The data exclude the self-employed, volunteers, unpaid family workers, and domestics.

The Oregon Employment Department and the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) work cooperatively to develop and publish monthly payroll employment and labor force data for Oregon's metropolitan areas and counties. The estimates of monthly job gains and losses are based on a survey of businesses. The estimates of unemployment are based on a survey of households and other sources.

The Oregon Employment Department payroll employment estimates are revised quarterly using information from unemployment insurance tax records. All department publications use data from this *official Oregon series* unless noted.

The department also makes the BLS-produced nonfarm payroll employment series for metropolitan areas available. These are revised annually by BLS.
