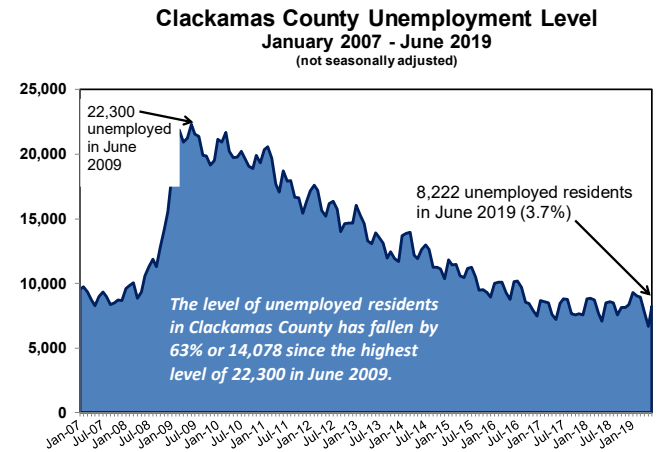

Unemployment rate increased slightly to 3.7 percent in June with 8,222 residents unemployed.

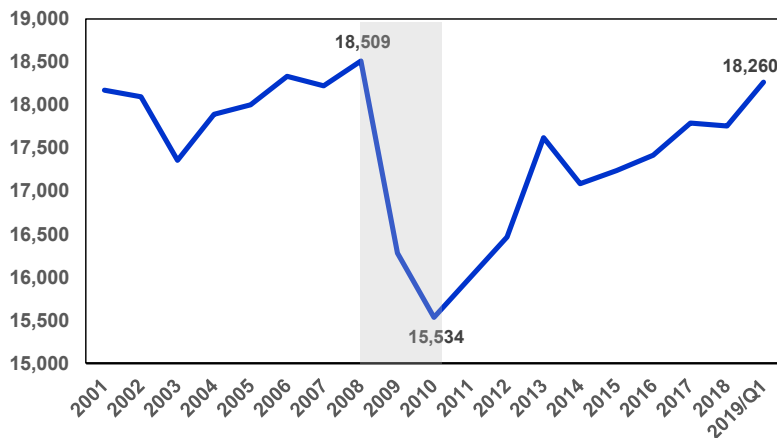


Industry and Labor Force Trends

During the last 12 months, the job-growth engines in Clackamas County were in manufacturing (+900 jobs); professional and business services (+500 jobs); and transportation, warehousing and utilities (+500 jobs). Job losses were seen in retail trade (-300), financial activities (-200), and other services (-100). The unemployment level rose to 3.7 from 3.0 percent the previous month.

Manufacturing in Clackamas County has nearly reached pre-recessionary levels

The county has added back most of the jobs lost in manufacturing during the recession.

- The county's manufacturing sector lost nearly 3,000 jobs during the recession and now has almost reached pre-recessionary levels. During 2019/Q1, manufacturing employment reached 18,260 adding back 2,726 jobs since the recession.
- The county's real average wage in manufacturing (adjusted for inflation) was \$66,250 in 2018. The industry's real wage has increased by \$5,739 or 9.5 percent since 2001.
