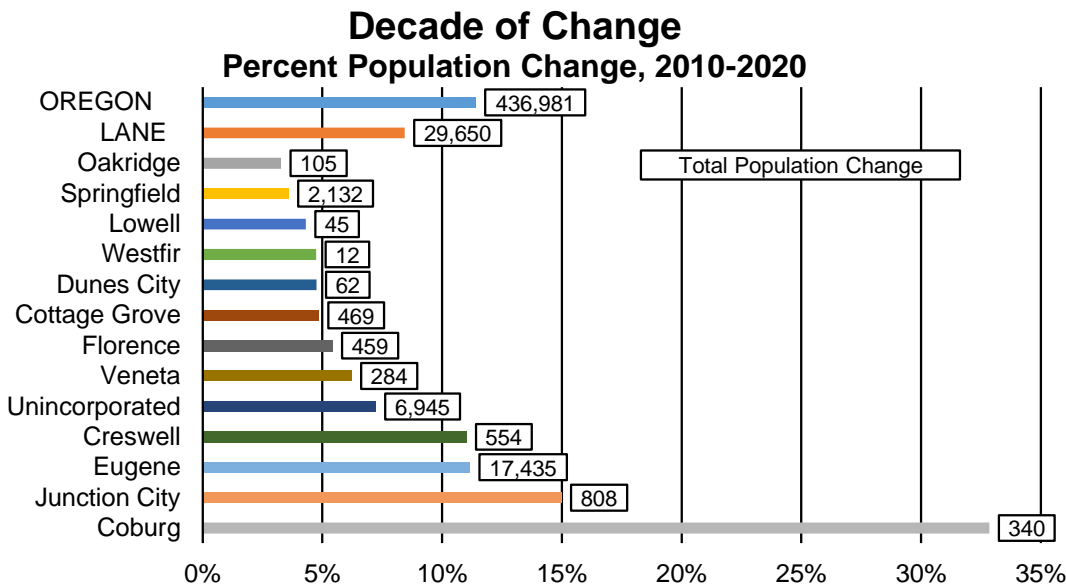


LANE COUNTY ECONOMIC INDICATORS
