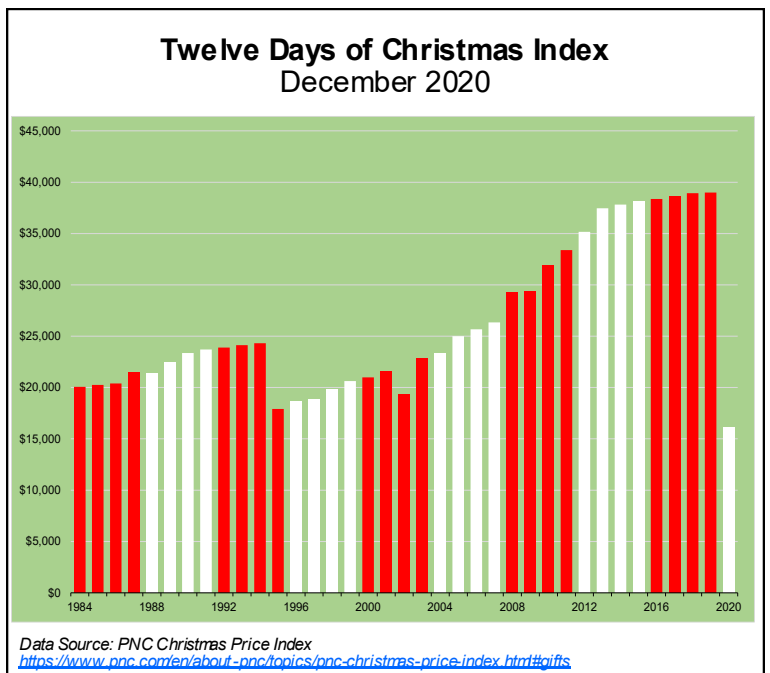
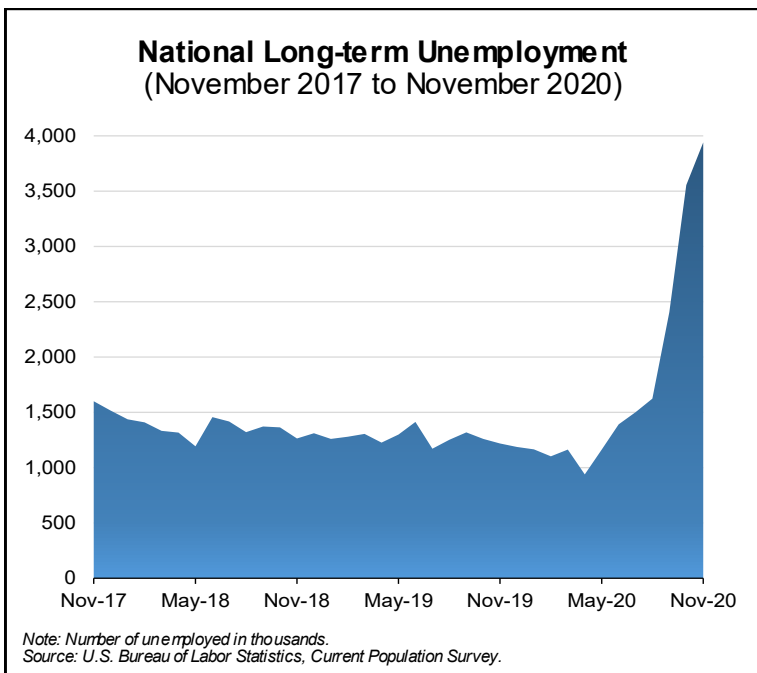
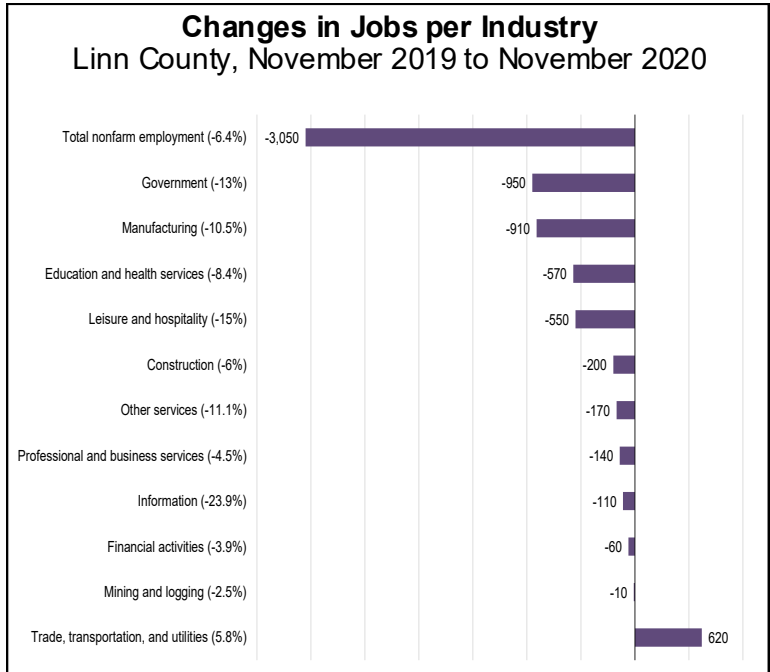
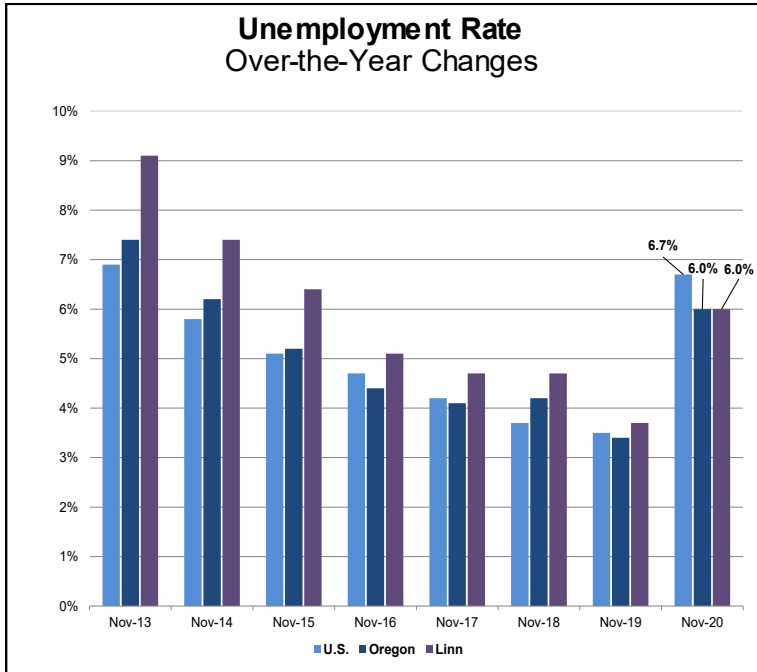


Mid-Valley Economic Indicators— Linn County, November Data

Linn County's economy continued to recover in November. The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate in the county was 6.0%, down from the October revised unemployment rate of 6.9%. Total nonfarm employment (not seasonally adjusted) improved 0.5% from October, but is down 6.4% over the past year.

National Long-term Unemployment (measured as those unemployed for 27 or more weeks) continued to increase. The worsening state of the pandemic in recent months may exacerbate this trend in the short-run.

On a brighter note, the Graph of the Month tracks the cost of the "Twelve Days of Christmas." According to data provided by the good people at PNC, the cost to purchase the items of the popular Christmas song decreased dramatically this season. Don't get too excited, the reason for the 58% cost decrease is due to many items being unavailable this year. Seven Swans-A-Swimming were the most expensive (\$13,125). Cost for all the items this year: \$16,168.14.
