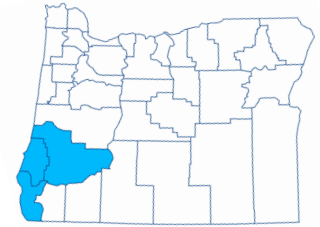

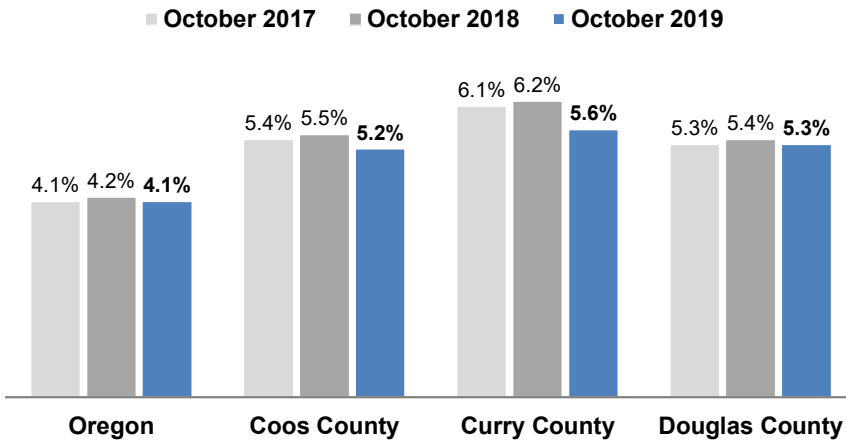

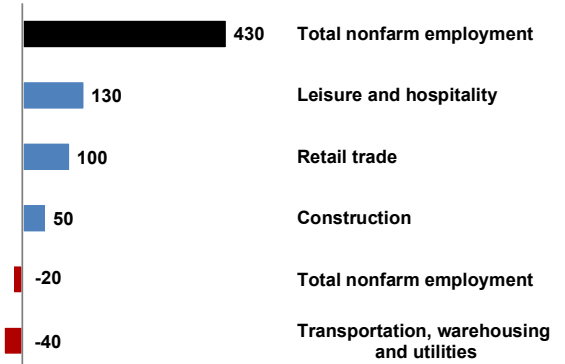


Industry Gains and Losses

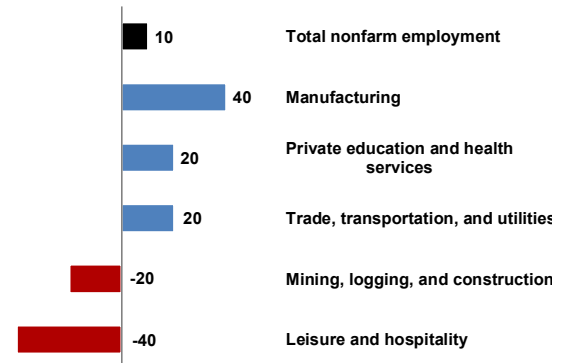
Over-the-year net change in employment

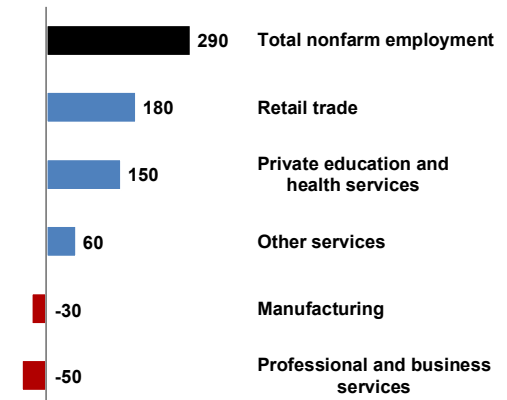
Coos County Net Job Growth



Curry County Net Job Growth



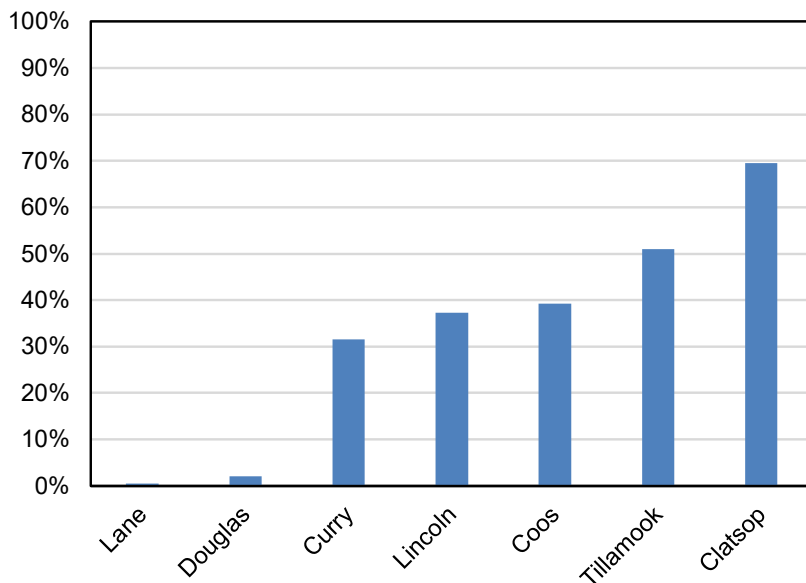
Douglas County Net Job Growth

Regional economist Guy Tauer recently examined payroll employment in modeled inundation zone maps produced by the Oregon Department of Geology and Mineral Industries. Under the "CZXXL" worst-case model, payroll employment in the tsunami inundation zone varied between 36,700 in January to about 41,200 in August 2018. Roughly a third of Coos and Curry counties' payroll employment (39% and 32% respectively) fell within the "CZXXL" inundation zone in 2018. Leisure and hospitality workers are the most likely to be affected, as many hotels, restaurants, and recreational activities are located near the shoreline. Read the full article [here](#).
