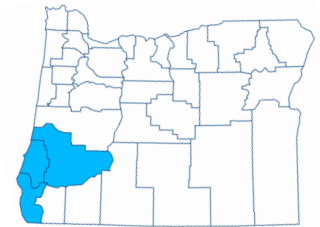

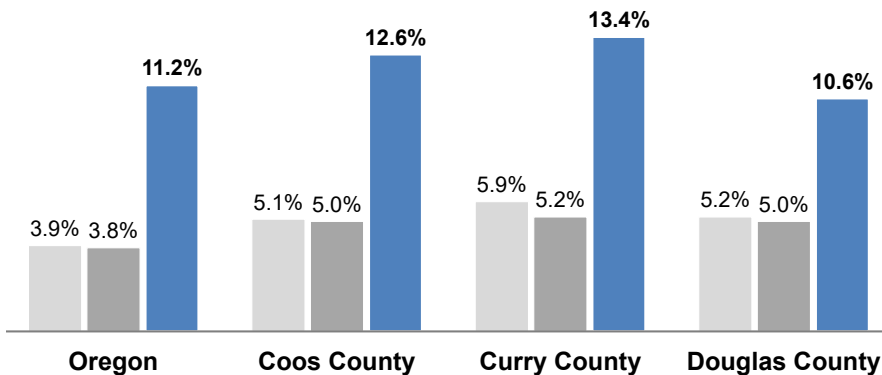


Local and State Unemployment Rates

Industry Gains and Losses

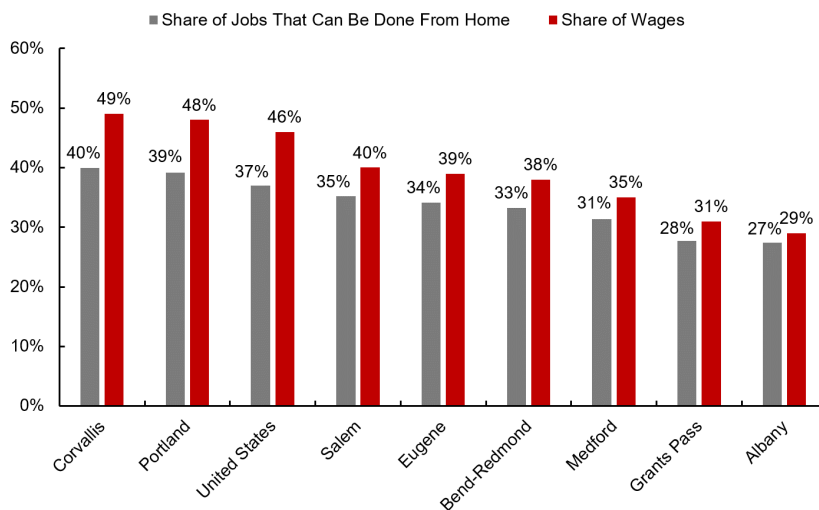
Over-the-year net change in employment

A Closer Look at Who Can Work From Home

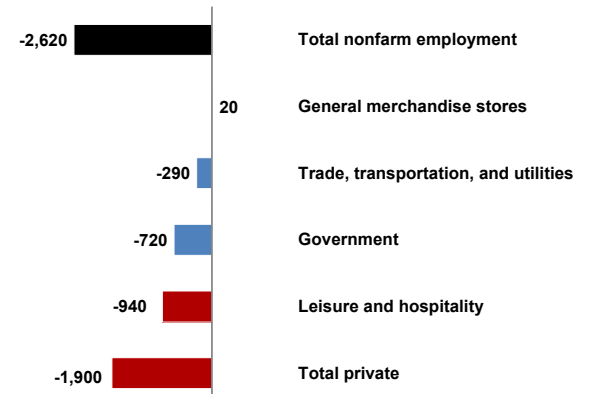
Share of Jobs That Can Be Done From Home and Wages, by Metro Area



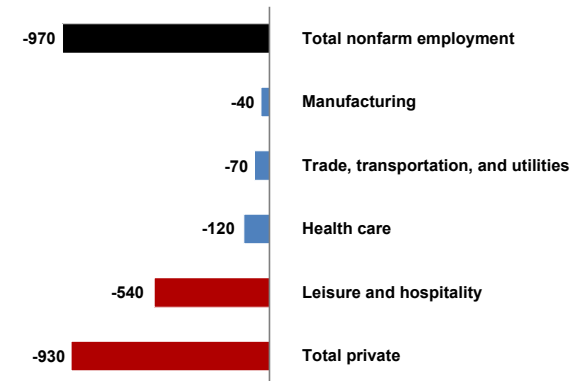
