(I'll just call them "WA's" here)

OED's Workforce Analyst Team

Program Purpose: To provide economic and labor market information to Oregon business and employers

They are also tasked with providing information and training for OED's Workforce Ops staff (yep – you!)

- **Workforce Analysts are Economists**
- They can give you occupational information (wages, wage ranges, openings, employment level projections, recruitment and retention data, skills analysis), and population trends at the state, county and sub-county levels
- They provide information to Oregon Employers, professional news media, workforce professionals, legislators, and WorkSource partners
- Our day-to-day is responding to direct customer information requests, in addition to giving presentations, writing articles, and keeping up on economic trends

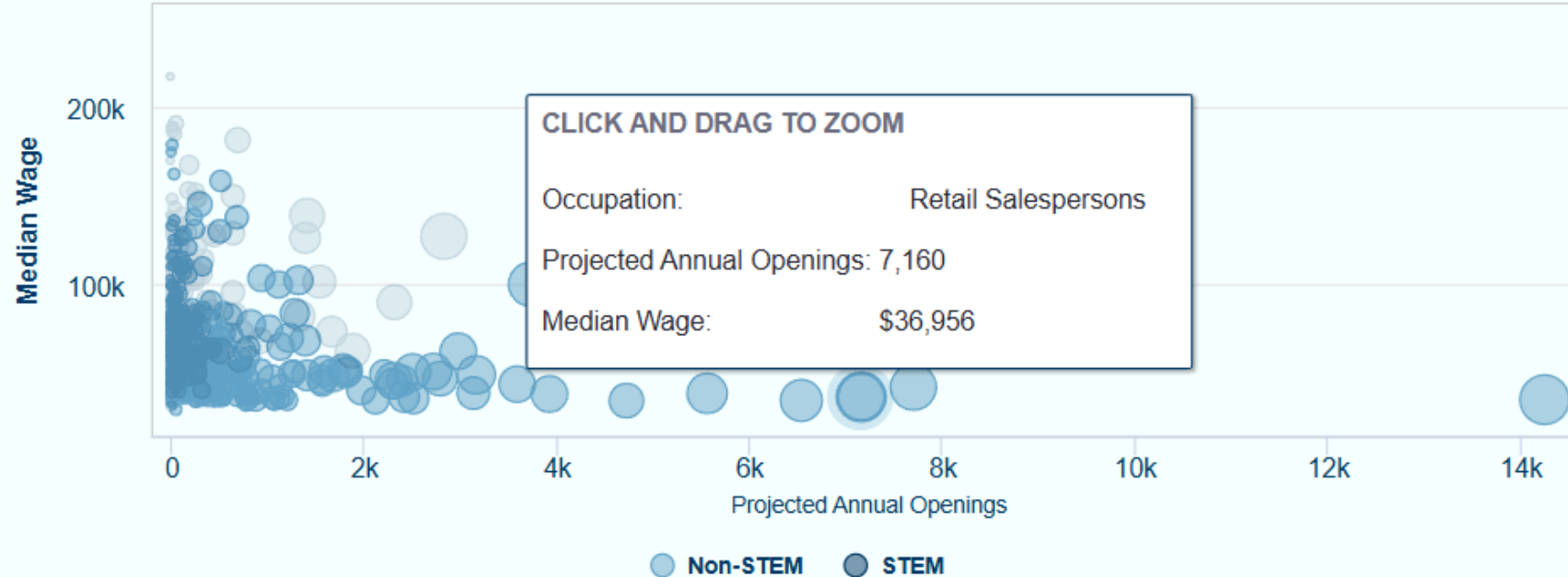

Oregon to Add 170,000 New Jobs by 2033

Oregon's job growth will total 8% between 2023 and 2033. Private payrolls are expected to grow by 150,500 (6%), while government employment will increase by 10,700 (6%), and self-employment will grow by 8,800 (6%).

For every new job added by growing and expanding businesses, Oregon employers are expected to have another nine job openings requiring newly trained workers to replace those who leave the labor force or make a major occupational change.

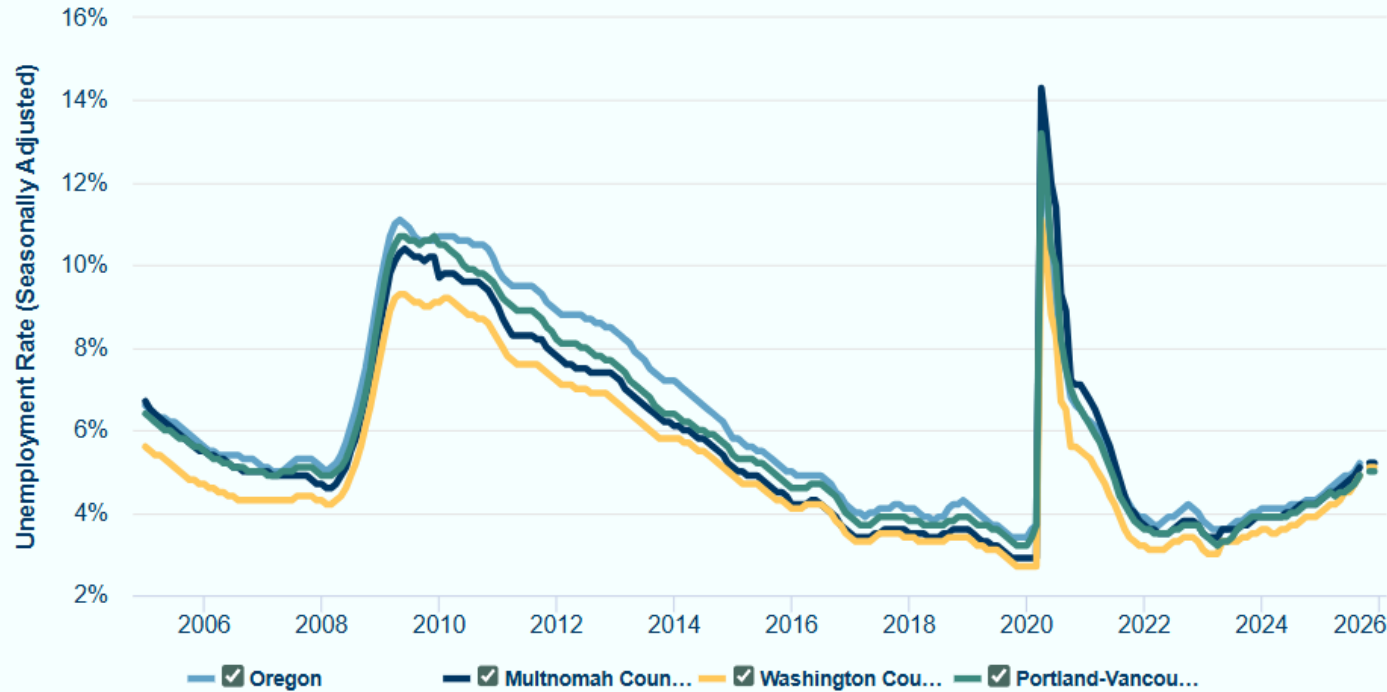

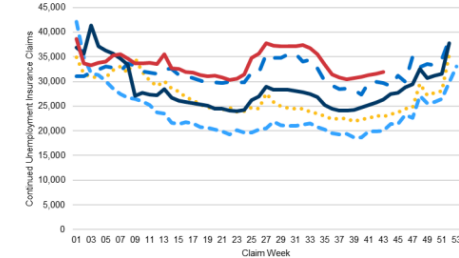

Continued UI Claims Increased Year-Over-Year in Oregon.

Continued claims reflect the current number of insured unemployed workers filing for regular Unemployment Insurance (UI) benefits. This includes workers in private and public organizations covered by unemployment insurance, and includes federal civilian workers covered by Unemployment Compensation for Federal Employees (UCFE).

After staying relatively low in 2024, continued claims have remained slightly elevated in 2025. In 2022, Oregon averaged the lowest level of continued claims in recent years, with about 23,500 per week. Oregon is averaging about 33,600 continued claims per week so far in 2025. That's 20% higher than the same period a year ago.

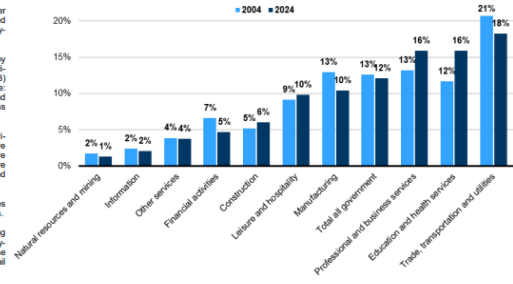
The local economy of the Portland-Hillsboro-Vancouver Metropolitan Statistical Area in Oregon has changed quite a lot over the past 20 years. Total payroll employment increased 20%, from \$21,985 to 1,033,355.

The top three industries in the Portland MSA in 2004 by employment were: (1) trade, transportation, and utilities; (2) professional and business services; and (3) manufacturing. In 2024, the top three industries were: (1) trade, transportation, and utilities; (2) education and health services; and (3) professional and business services.

Education and health services had the largest numerical and percentage increase in employment. There are 68,000 (42%) more jobs in the sector than there were twenty years ago. This is mostly due to the healthcare industry growing as the region has gotten older and more care workers are needed.

Natural resources and mining and financial activities saw declines in employment over the last twenty years.

Trade, transportation, and utilities and manufacturing saw the largest decline in overall share of total employment, both declining by three percentage points as the region's economy shifts away from relying on retail stores and manufacturing.

Oregon Had A Holiday Buildup of 9,300 Employees in 2024, an 8.5% Increase from September to December

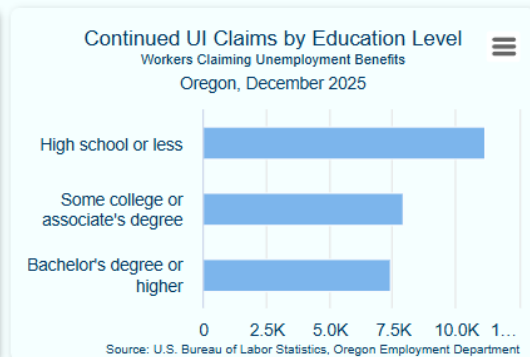
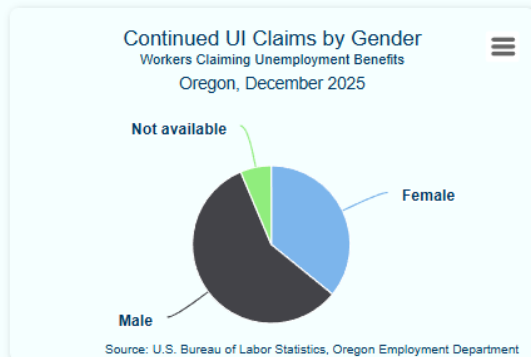
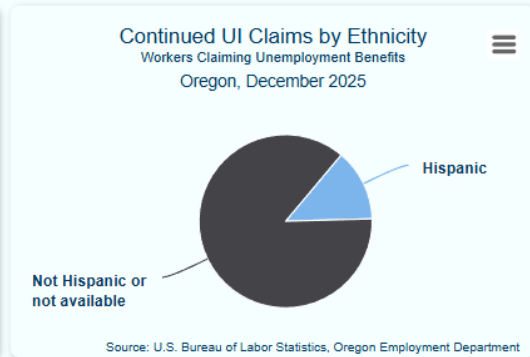
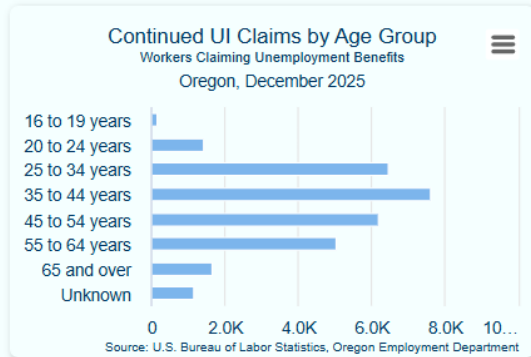
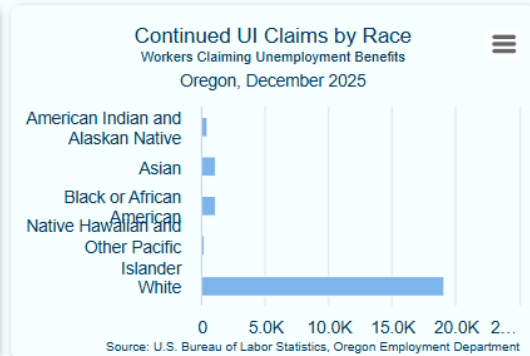
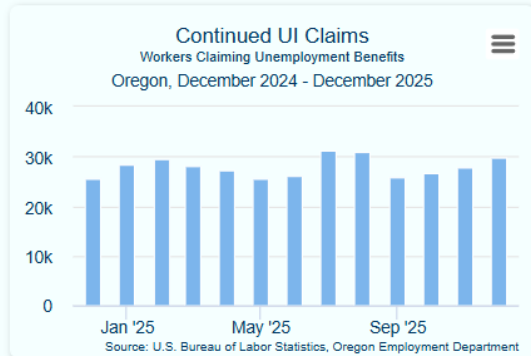
The 2024 holiday season had a holiday buildup of 9,300 employees, an 8.5% increase from September to December. That's higher than the 8,700 (7.7%) buildup in 2023 and the 7,100 (6.2%) rise in 2022.

At the same time, holiday hiring businesses employed fewer workers throughout 2024, and failed to reach the peak December employment of the previous two years. The December 2024 peak was 1,500 jobs lower than 2023 and 2,500 jobs lower than 2022. The September 2024 base was 2,200 lower than September 2023 and 4,800 lower than 2022.

This corresponds to a looser labor market in 2024. In the few years immediately following the pandemic recession, Oregon's unemployment rate dropped historically low and job vacancies reached historic highs. This meant that employers had a hard time finding employees and were more reluctant to let them go once they had them. Oregon's unemployment rate fell to 3.6% in mid-2023, close to its lowest recorded rate, but then drifted upwards, rising to 4.1% by the start of 2024 and 4.3% by the end of the year. The lower September employment base and higher holiday buildup could indicate that employers were more likely to let go of workers in 2024 and had more bargaining power to bring them back during that year's holiday season.

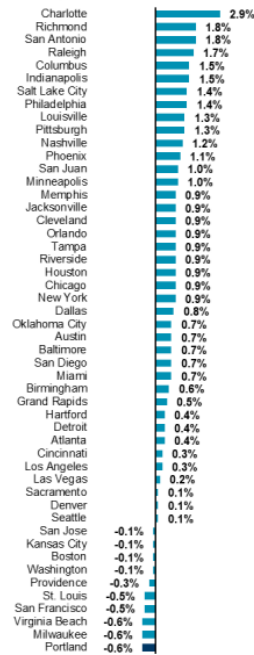

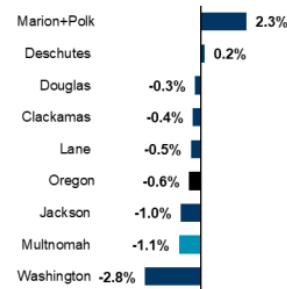

Percentage Growth — Sep. 2024 to Sep. 2025



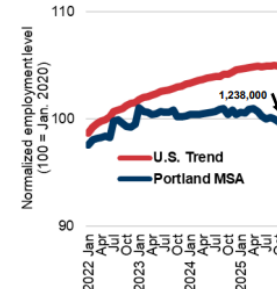
Employment Growth by County
Sep. 2024 to Sep. 2025



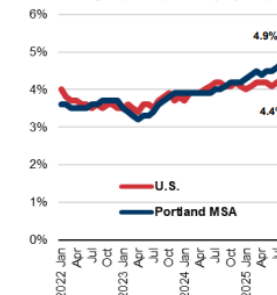

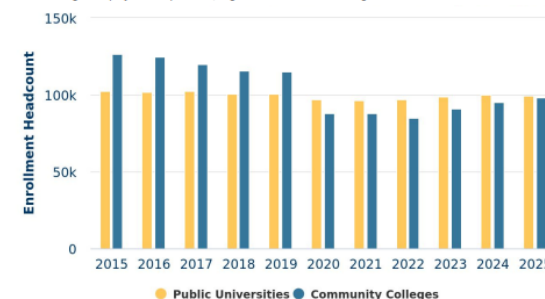

Oregon Public Higher Education Enrollment Increased in 2025

Public universities and community colleges benefit Oregon's economy by creating a more skilled and productive workforce, generating state and local tax revenue, driving local spending, and contributing to research and innovation. Enrollment in these institutions rose by 1.5% between 2024 and 2025, according to a new report by the Higher Education Coordinating Commission, spurred by a 3.7% increase in community college enrollment. Public university enrollment fell slightly by 0.8%.

Enrollment was fairly evenly split between community colleges and universities in 2025. Around 98,400 students attended community colleges and 99,600 attended universities. Full time enrollment differed significantly, however. Just over a fifth of community college students attended community full-time as opposed to over four-fifths of university students.

Oregon's third largest public university, Portland State, saw enrollment dip by 773 to 19,697, continuing a decades-long decline. That represents a 3.8% drop over the year and 29.8% over the decade.

Employment Reports Delayed Again After Federal Government Shutdown

The U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) has resumed production of the monthly employment reports for the nation on a delayed schedule after the lapse in federal government appropriations that began on Oct. 1, 2025.

The most recent update from the BLS on Wednesday, Nov. 19 says, "BLS will not publish an October 2025 Employment Situation news release. Establishment survey data from the Current Employment Statistics survey for October 2025 will be published with the November 2025 data. Household survey data from the Current Population Survey could not be collected for the October 2025 reference period due to a lapse in appropriations. The household survey data is not able to be retroactively collected. The collection period for November 2025 data will be extended for both surveys, and extra processing time will be added."

Currently, Oregon's monthly nonfarm job estimates and unemployment rate are still not available beyond August 2025 and publication dates for the states and metropolitan areas have not been announced.
