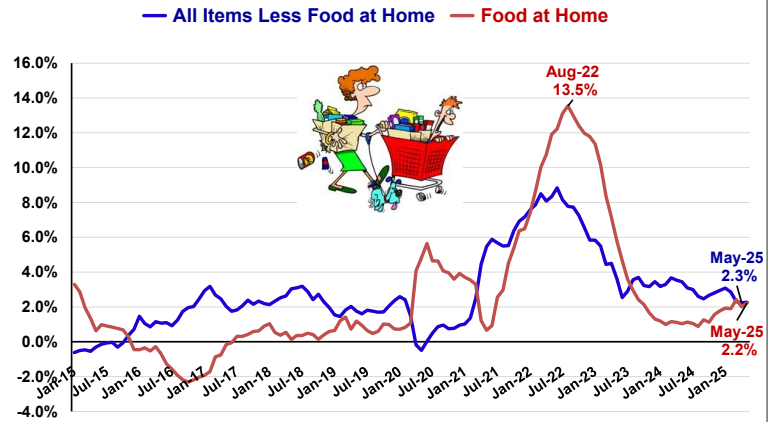

June 2025 (May data)

Graph of the Month: In May, the Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers rose by 2.4% over the last 12 months.

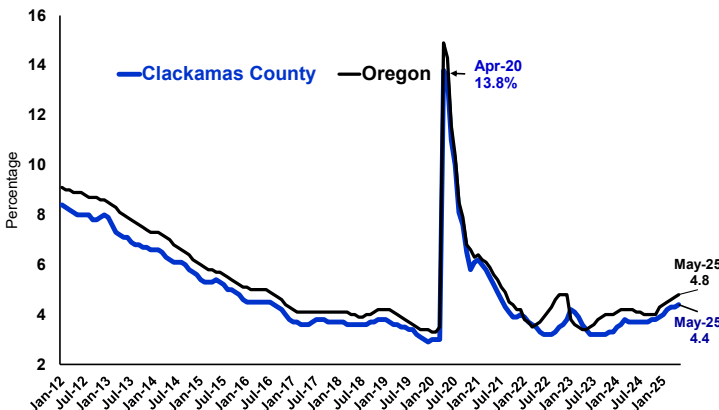
- The consumer price index (CPI) is a measure of the average change over time in the prices paid by urban consumers for a market basket of consumer goods and services.
- In May, the 12-month change for all items less food at home was at 2.3%, a decrease of 1.1 percentage points from one year earlier. Contrastingly, the year-over-year index for food at home increased from a year ago by 1.2 percentage points — making it more expensive to feed a family.

- The *seasonally adjusted* unemployment rate in Clackamas County during May rose to 4.4% from 4.3% the previous month. The number of residents who were unemployed and actively seeking work in the county rose to 10,048 in May from 9,787 the previous month.
- Total nonfarm employment in Clackamas County reached 173,500 in May, an increase of 600 jobs from the previous month.
- The year-over-year net change in industry employment in May was at 500 with local government (+1,100) and private educational and health services (+1,000) adding the most jobs. The majority of job losses were in professional and business services (-600); manufacturing (-400); construction (-300); and wholesale trade (-300).

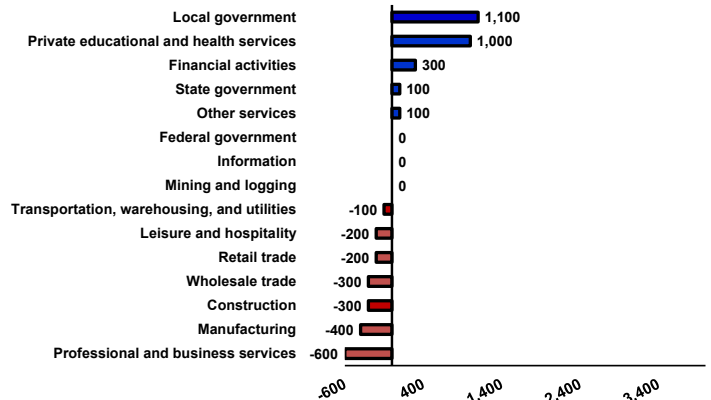
Number of Unemployed Residents
