Graph of the Month: New jobs in the Portland Tri-County region expected to grow by 7% during the next decade.

- Employment in the Portland Tri-County is expected to increase by 77,400 jobs (7%) from 2024 to 2034.
- Private sector health care and social assistance is expected to grow the fastest at 13% adding 20,900 jobs to the region.
- Professional and business services is projected to grow by 11% adding 17,500 new jobs, followed by construction growing by 11% adding 6,300 jobs.

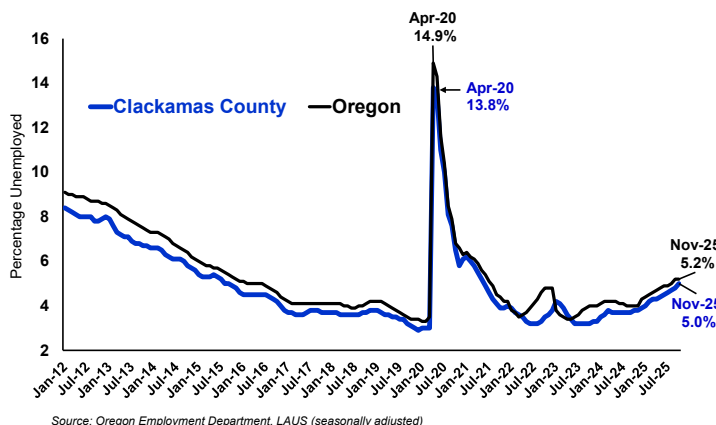

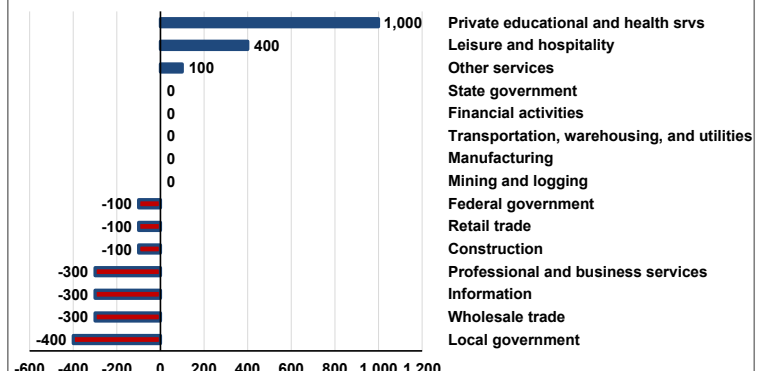
- The *seasonally adjusted* unemployment rate in Clackamas County during November rose to 5.0% from 4.8% in September and 3.8% from a year ago.
- Covered employment in Clackamas County reached 173,800 in November, a decrease of -300 jobs from the previous month and a decrease of -100 jobs from a year ago.
- Clackamas County saw positive year-to-year employment growth during the last 11 months in 2025 except for the months of September (-0.3%) and November (-0.1%). Three industries saw year-to-year job growth in November: private educational and health services, leisure and hospitality, and other services.
