

Unemployment Rate News

Both Morrow and Umatilla counties' seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for May 2025 increased by 0.1 percentage point over the previous month.

Both counties' rates were above Oregon's statewide rate of 4.8% and also above the national rate of 4.2%.

Both counties' rates continue trending above their 2024 rates.

Nonfarm Employment Change

May 2024 to May 2025

Morrow County lost an estimated 60 jobs over the year. The private sector increased by 220 jobs and the public sector dropped 280 jobs. Job gains over the year came from private-sector industries, most notably in construction. Losses were largely led by local government while professional and business services contributed noteworthy job losses.


Umatilla County gained an estimated 60 jobs over the year. The private sector increased by 150 jobs while the public sector dropped by a net of 90 positions overall. Private education and health services, information, state government, and professional and business services led gains. Notable losses came from retail trade, local education, and manufacturing.
