
Note: After being delayed by the federal shutdown, Oregon's local monthly employment reports for September will be released on Tuesday, December 16th. In the meantime, I'll be highlighting other recent data releases from our programs. We will return to the regular schedule of monthly local data releases in 2026.

Job Vacancies: The number of private job vacancies declined in Oregon over the year to the summer of 2025, with a larger level of decline in the Willamette Valley than other regions. In Oregon, there were around 2 unemployed people per vacancy, higher than in 2022, but much lower than 2020.
