
Northwest Oregon Economic Indicators

For Benton, Clatsop, Columbia, Lincoln & Tillamook Counties October 2025 (August 2025 Data)

The U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics suspended production of monthly employment and unemployment reports for the nation, states, and metropolitan areas as of Oct. 1, 2025. Other labor market information continues to be available on QualityInfo.org.

While we wait for new employment data from the Bureau of Labor Statistics to be released, we will be taking another look at the employment numbers for August, as well as recently published job vacancy information and federal government employment in Oregon. Key Takeaways

Seasonally adjusted unemployment rates increased across Northwest Oregon in all five counties and remained above levels seen one year ago. Three of the five counties saw over-the-year job losses, with Columbia and Benton counties seeing a gain over the year. A variety of industries saw job gains across the region, including private education and health services and leisure and hospitality. However, Clatsop and Lincoln counties each saw decreases in leisure and hospitality employment.



Civilian federal government employment represented roughly 1% of total nonfarm employment in Northwest Oregon in the fourth quarter of 2024. Percentages ranged from 0.7% in Columbia County to 1.8% in Lincoln County.

Summer job vacancies in Northwest Oregon increased by 37% compared with this time last year. Job vacancies at the state level decreased by 12%. Jobs paying under \$20 an hour decreased by 16%, while vacancies for jobs paying \$30 and up increased by 15%.
