

Federal Government Shutdown Pauses Employment Reports

The U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) suspended the monthly employment and unemployment reports for the nation, states, and metropolitan areas as of Oct. 1, 2025. Eastern Oregon's monthly jobs and unemployment rate for September are unavailable at this time. In the meantime, we will highlight data that we continue to produce and share as it becomes available.





Job Vacancy Survey News

Results from the <u>Summer 2025 Job Vacancy Survey</u> are out now.

According to the survey, the ratio of unemployed persons to job vacancies in Oregon was at 2.2 for Summer 2025. This was an increase from the previous quarter's ratio of 1.8 and continues an upward trend since 2022.

In other news from the survey, the statewide average hourly wage decreased by \$1.62 per hour from the previous quarter. Employers reported difficulty filling 57% of summer vacancies, which was a 1% decrease from Spring 2025.


Unemployment Rate News

Grant County's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate held at 6.5% during the first quarter of 2025, dropped to 6.4% in April, and increased to a high of 7.3% by August.

Harney County's rate held at 4.5% from January to May, and gradually increased to 4.8% by August. It remained below the statewide rate from March through August.

Malheur County's rate stayed fairly consistent through June 2025 before increasing to the year-to-date high of 4.7% in August. It remained below the statewide rate and matched the national rate of 4.2% in April.
