

# Federal Government Shutdown Pauses Employment Reports

Federal government employment has been trending down over the past 23 years. In 2024 the sector employed 80 fewer workers (-20%) compared with 2001. Current employment data won't reflect those who took the buyout option and remain on payrolls until September. Those declines will show up in October estimates.

While employment has decreased over this period, average wages have increased \$523 (1%). Wages were \$10,815 above the average annual wage in Oregon in 2024.



# Federal Government Shutdown Pauses Employment Reports

\$77,100 Federal government employment has been relatively stable over \$64,250 the past 23 years. In 2024 the sector employed 30 fewer work-\$51,400 ers (-23%) compared with 2001. Current employment data won't \$38,550 reflect those who took the buyout option and remain on payrolls un-\$25,700 til September. Those declines will show up in October estimates.

While employment has decreased over this period, average wages have increased \$18,515 (28%). Wages were \$12,804 above the average annual wage in Oregon in 2024.


# **DOUGLAS COUNTY ECONOMIC INDICATORS**
