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Employment in Corvallis MSA (Benton County): December 2025

Benton County's Unemployment Rate Remains at 4.5%

Benton County's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 4.5% in December, matching the revised unemployment rate for November. Benton County's unemployment rate has increased from 3.8% to 4.5% over the past year. Oregon's statewide seasonally adjusted unemployment rate in December was 5.2%.

Benton County's employment losses in December were normal; total nonfarm employment was down 60 during the month, when an employment decrease of 60 jobs would be expected. As a result, seasonally adjusted employment was unchanged between November and December. Seasonally adjusted total nonfarm employment is now up 0.7% from the level in February 2020, or 310 jobs above its pre-pandemic level.

Over the past year Benton County's seasonally adjusted total nonfarm employment has shed 720 jobs or -1.6%.

The private sector overall lost 60 jobs over the month. Leisure and hospitality shed 50 jobs in December. Professional and business services employment declined 30 jobs.

Public sector employment overall was unchanged in December. Local government employment decreased by 10. Federal government added 10 jobs. State government employment was unchanged in December.

Nonfarm Payroll Employment: Official Oregon Series. Data are by place of work and cover full- and part-time employees who worked or received pay for the pay period that includes the 12th of the month. The data exclude the self-employed, volunteers, unpaid family workers, and domestics.

The Oregon Employment Department and the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) work cooperatively to develop and publish monthly payroll employment and labor force data for Oregon's metropolitan areas and counties. The estimates of monthly job gains and losses are based on a survey of businesses. The estimates of unemployment are based on a survey of households and other sources.

The Oregon Employment Department payroll employment estimates are revised quarterly using information from unemployment insurance tax records. All department publications use data from this *official Oregon series* unless noted.

The department also makes the BLS-produced nonfarm payroll employment series for metropolitan areas available. These are revised annually by BLS.
