Employment in Corvallis MSA (Benton County): September 2025

Benton County's Unemployment Rate Ticks Up to 4.3%

Benton County's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 4.3% in September, edging up from its August rate of 4.1%. Oregon's statewide unemployment rate in September was 5.2%, up from its August rate of 5.0%.

Benton County's employment gains in September were less than normal; total nonfarm employment was up 1,130 during the month, when an employment increase of 1,290 jobs would be expected. As a result, seasonally adjusted employment decreased 160 jobs between August and September. Seasonally adjusted total nonfarm employment is now up 0.6% from the level in February 2020, or 240 jobs above its pre-pandemic level.

Over the past year Benton County's seasonally adjusted total nonfarm employment is down 720 jobs or -1.6%.

The private sector overall shed 130 jobs over the month. Leisure and hospitality dropped 100 jobs in September. Financial activities and other services each had employment declines of 20.

The public sector overall added 1,260 jobs in September. Local government employment increased by 1,260. Federal and state government employment were both unchanged in September.

Civilian labor force includes employed and unemployed individuals 16 years and older by place of residence.

Employed includes payroll employment, self-employed, unpaid family workers, domestics, agriculture, and labor disputants.

Unemployment rate is calculated by dividing unemployed by civilian labor force.

Nonfarm Payroll Employment: Official Oregon Series. Data are by place of work and cover full- and part-time employees who worked or received pay for the pay period that includes the 12th of the month. The data exclude the self-employed, volunteers, unpaid family workers, and domestics.

The Oregon Employment Department and the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) work cooperatively to develop and publish monthly payroll employment and labor force data for Oregon's metropolitan areas and counties. The estimates of monthly job gains and losses are based on a survey of businesses. The estimates of unemployment are based on a survey of households and other sources.

The Oregon Employment Department payroll employment estimates are revised quarterly using information from unemployment insurance tax records. All department publications use data from this *official Oregon series* unless noted.

The department also makes the BLS-produced nonfarm payroll employment series for metropolitan areas available. These are revised annually by BLS.
