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Employment in Jackson County: March 2025 Total Employment Declined Slightly Over the Year

Total payroll employment in Jackson County rose by 200 jobs in March. Health care and social assistance added 150 jobs over the month. The return of workers who were on strike at a major health care provider contributed to the jobs added in health care and social assistance during March. Other industries adding jobs over the month were leisure and hospitality (+110); construction (+40); and professional and business services (+30). Small employment declines were estimated in retail trade (-40); transportation, warehousing, and utilities (-30); financial activities (-30); and manufacturing (-20).

Over the past year, payroll employment in the Medford MSA (Jackson County) slipped by 80 jobs, or -0.1%. Since March 2024, industries adding jobs were private education and health services (+560); retail trade (+230); and other services (+110). Industries with over-the-year losses included leisure and hospitality (-340); financial activities (-110); professional and business services (-30); and construction (-30). Government lost 300 jobs since March 2024, with losses in local government (-340) and federal government (-10) somewhat offset by a gain in state government (+50).

Jackson County's not seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was estimated at 5.9% in March, the same as in February and up slightly from 5.3% in March 2024.

Notes:

The Oregon Employment Department and the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) work cooperatively to develop and publish monthly payroll employment and labor force data for Oregon's metropolitan areas and counties. The estimates of monthly job gains and losses are based on a survey of businesses. The estimates of unemployment are based on a survey of households and other sources.

The Oregon Employment Department payroll employment estimates are revised quarterly using information from unemployment insurance tax records. All department publications use data from this *official Oregon series* unless noted. These preliminary estimates of jobs and other labor force data are produced in cooperation with the federal Bureau of Labor Statistics, are based largely on a survey of businesses and a survey of households, and are subject to later revision.

Labor force statistics for Oregon metropolitan statistical areas (MSAs) are produced by the U.S. Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics. Through June 2025, seasonally adjusted data are not available for Oregon MSAs or other MSAs around the country. New MSA definitions resulting from the 2020 Census are being incorporated into the history of the data series back to 1990, as well as other updates to the processing of labor force estimates for substate areas.
