Employment in Jackson County: May 2025 Leisure and Hospitality Gains Boost May Job Total

Total payroll employment in Jackson County rose by 460 jobs in May. Leisure and hospitality again posted the largest increase, up by 410 jobs. Smaller employment gains were estimated in private education and health services (+60); professional and business services (+40); and transportation, warehousing, and utilities (+20). Government employment climbed by 20 jobs, with state and local government each adding 10 jobs. Job totals fell over the month in retail trade (-80), and manufacturing (-30).

Over the past year, payroll employment in the Medford MSA (Jackson County) climbed by 420 jobs, or 0.5%. Since May 2024 industries adding jobs were private education and health services (+750); leisure and hospitality (+220); and professional and business services (+80). Industries shedding jobs were manufacturing (-150), wholesale trade (-90), and financial activities (-70). Government employment slipped by 270 jobs over the year. Local government education was down by 370 jobs while state government employment rose by 90 since May 2024. Federal government employment fell by 30 jobs over the same period.

Jackson County's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was estimated at 5.2% in May, from 5.1% in April and up slightly from 4.8% in May 2024.

The Oregon Employment Department plans to release the June county and metropolitan area unemployment rates and employment survey data on Tuesday, July 22nd, and the statewide unemployment rate and employment survey data for June on Wednesday, July 16th.

Notes:

The Oregon Employment Department and the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) work cooperatively to develop and publish monthly payroll employment and labor force data for Oregon's metropolitan areas and counties. The estimates of monthly job gains and losses are based on a survey of businesses. The estimates of unemployment are based on a survey of households and other sources.

The Oregon Employment Department payroll employment estimates are revised quarterly using information from unemployment insurance tax records. All department publications use data from this *official Oregon series* unless noted. These preliminary estimates of jobs and other labor force data are produced in cooperation with the federal Bureau of Labor Statistics, are based largely on a survey of businesses and a survey of households, and are subject to later revision.

Civilian labor force includes employed and unemployed individuals 16 years and older by place of residence. Employed includes payroll employment, self-employed, unpaid family workers, domestics, agriculture, and labor disputants. Unemployment rate is calculated by dividing unemployed by civilian labor force.

Nonfarm Payroll Employment: Official Oregon Series. Data are by place of work and cover full- and part-time employees who worked or received pay for the pay period that includes the 12th of the month. The data exclude the self-employed, volunteers, unpaid family workers, and domestics.
