## Employment in Josephine County: June 2025 Leisure and Hospitality Adds Most Jobs Over the Month

Total payroll employment in Josephine County declined by 100 jobs in June. Private education and health services lost 140 jobs over the month. Smaller declines were estimated in other services, and professional and business services, both down 20 jobs. Leisure and hospitality was the only private-sector industry with a notable gain, up by 70 jobs. Government employment showed a net decline of 20 jobs in June. Local government education fell by 50 jobs, but slight gains were posted in local government excluding educational services (+20), and state government (+10).

Over the past year, payroll employment in the Grants Pass MSA (Josephine County) was down by 780 jobs, a loss of 2.8%. Employment fell over the year in most private-sector industries. The most notable declines occurred in leisure and hospitality (-180); private education and health services (-160); retail trade (-130); financial activities (-130); construction (-70); and wholesale trade (-30). Wood product manufacturing bucked the trend, gaining 60 jobs since June 2024.

Government employment fell by 50 jobs over the year. An increase in state government (+70) was offset by a loss of 90 jobs in local government and 20 federal government jobs.

Josephine County's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was estimated at 6.6% in June, from 6.4% in May and up from the June 2024 rate of 5.7%.

The Oregon Employment Department plans to release the July county and metropolitan area unemployment rates and employment survey data on Tuesday, Aug. 19th, and the statewide unemployment rate and employment survey data for July on Wednesday, Aug 13th.

The Oregon Employment Department and the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) work cooperatively to develop and publish monthly payroll employment and labor force data for Oregon's metropolitan areas and counties. The estimates of monthly job gains and losses are based on a survey of businesses. The estimates of unemployment are based on a survey of households and other sources.

The Oregon Employment Department payroll employment estimates are revised quarterly using information from unemployment insurance tax records. All department publications use data from this *official Oregon series* unless noted.

The department also makes the BLS-produced nonfarm payroll employment series for metropolitan areas available. These are revised annually by BLS.

Civilian labor force includes employed and unemployed individuals 16 years and older by place of residence. Employed includes payroll employment, self-employed, unpaid family workers, domestics, agriculture, and labor disputants. Unemployment rate is calculated by dividing unemployed by civilian labor force.

Nonfarm Payroll Employment: Official Oregon Series. Data are by place of work and cover full- and part-time employees who worked or received pay for the pay period that includes the 12th of the month. The data exclude the self-employed, volunteers, unpaid family workers, and domestics.
