## Federal Government Shutdown Pauses Employment Reports

The U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) suspended the monthly employment and unemployment reports for the nation, states, and metropolitan areas as of Oct. 1, 2025. The Portland metropolitan area's monthly jobs and unemployment rate data for September are unavailable at this time. In the meantime, the Oregon Employment Department will highlight data and analysis that we continue to produce. One such topic is federal government employment.

## Federal Government Jobs in the Portland Metropolitan Area

The Portland metropolitan area had an average of 18,900 federal government jobs during the 12 months ending in August 2025 (the most recent data available). This accounted for 1.5% of total employment; a smaller share than Oregon's rural counties (2.5%), the average large metro (1.9%), and the nation (1.9%).

Federal government employment declined by 700 jobs (-3.6%) over the year ending in August 2025, a significantly faster rate of decline than for all industries (-0.5%). In comparison, federal government declined by 3.9% statewide and 3.1% nationally.

Federal government tends to pay relatively high wages: \$106,658 annually on average (2024); 36% higher than the average across all industries (\$74,672). Read more about federal government jobs in the Portland metropolitan area.
