Employment in Tillamook County: November 2025

Seasonally adjusted employment decreased by 70 in November

Today, the Oregon Employment Department released monthly employment and unemployment data for November 2025 in Tillamook County, after a significant delay due to the federal government shutdown.

Tillamook County's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 5.5% in November, up from 5.3% in September. It was 4.4% the year before. The October unemployment rate is not available since the underlying data was not collected due to the federal government shutdown that month. The statewide unemployment rate was 5.2% in November, and the national rate was 4.6%.

Seasonally adjusted nonfarm payroll employment decreased by 70 in November to 9,530 jobs. Seasonally adjusted figures compare expected changes with actual changes. Employment was expected to decrease by 110 jobs, and the county lost 180 jobs, with a loss of 150 jobs in the private sector and a loss of 30 jobs in total government employment. Leisure and hospitality lost the most jobs with a decline of 70 jobs (-4.7%). Local education lost 20 jobs (-2.6%).

November's total nonfarm employment was mostly unchanged from the previous year at 9,500 jobs. Nondurable goods manufacturing added 90 jobs (+7.3%). Professional and business services lost 50 jobs (-12.8%). Local education lost 20 jobs over the year (-2.6%).

Nonfarm Payroll Employment: Data are by place of work and cover full- and part-time employees who worked or received pay for the pay period that includes the 12th of the month. The data exclude the self-employed, volunteers, unpaid family workers, and domestics.

The Oregon Employment Department and the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) work cooperatively to develop and publish monthly payroll employment and labor force data for Oregon's metropolitan areas and counties. The estimates of monthly job gains and losses are based on a survey of businesses. The estimates of unemployment are based on a survey of households and other sources.

The Oregon Employment Department payroll employment estimates are revised quarterly using information from unemployment insurance tax records. All department publications use data from this *official Oregon series* unless noted.

The department also makes the BLS-produced nonfarm payroll employment series for metropolitan areas available. These are revised annually by BLS.
