Employment in Yamhill County: March 2025

Yamhill County's Unemployment Rate Remains at 4.3%

Yamhill County's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 4.3% in March, matching its revised rate of 4.3% in February. Oregon's statewide unemployment rate in March was 4.5%, up from its revised February rate of 4.4%.

Yamhill County's employment gains in March were more than normal; total nonfarm employment increased 370 jobs, when an employment increase of 300 jobs would be expected. As a result, seasonally adjusted employment was up 70 in March. Employment is 1,580 jobs (+4.5%) above the pre-pandemic level in February 2020.

The private sector added 310 jobs in March. The largest private-sector industry employment gains in March were reported in health care and social assistance (+150 jobs, +2.2%), professional and business services (+60 jobs, +2.7%), and private educational services (+60 jobs, +2.1%).

Yamhill County's public-sector employment was up 60 in March. Local government employment was up 60 jobs. State government employment and federal government employment were both unchanged in March.

Civilian labor force includes employed and unemployed individuals 16 years and older by place of residence. Employed includes payroll employment, self-employed, unpaid family workers, domestics, agriculture, and labor disputants. Unemployment rate is calculated by dividing unemployed by civilian labor force.

Nonfarm Payroll Employment: Data are by place of work and cover full- and part-time employees who worked or received pay for the pay period that includes the 12th of the month. The data exclude the self-employed, volunteers, unpaid family workers, and domestics.





The Oregon Employment Department and the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) work cooperatively to develop and publish monthly payroll employment and labor force data for Oregon's metropolitan areas and counties. The estimates of monthly job gains and losses are based on a survey of businesses. The estimates of unemployment are based on a survey of households and other sources.

The Oregon Employment Department payroll employment estimates are revised quarterly using information from unemployment insurance tax records. All department publications use data from this *official Oregon series* unless noted.

The department also makes the BLS-produced nonfarm payroll employment series for metropolitan areas available. These are revised annually by BLS.
