## November 2025 Employment and Unemployment in Oregon's Counties


Today the Oregon Employment Department released November 2025 jobs data after a significant delay due to the federal government shutdown. November 2025 unemployment data for Oregon's (and the nation's) metro areas have not been released by the Bureau of Labor Statistics. They are evaluating the data and will determine whether to publish them by Jan. 16, 2026.

In November, the unemployment rate increased over the year in all of Oregon's counties with published rates. Of the 31 counties with available data, 11 counties had unemployment rates at or below the statewide rate of 5.2%, and one (Hood River County) had a rate at or below the U.S. rate of 4.6%. The October unemployment rate is not available since underlying data was not collected due to the federal government shutdown that month.

Grant County had Oregon's highest seasonally adjusted unemployment rate in November at 7.9%. Other counties with relatively high unemployment rates were Klamath (7.5%) and Curry (6.9%). Hood River County registered the lowest unemployment rate in November at 4.2%. Wheeler County also had a relatively low unemployment rate at 4.7%.

November 2025



Between November 2024 and November 2025, total nonfarm employment rose in 16 of Oregon's counties and decreased in 20. Harney County had Oregon's highest year-over-year job growth at 7.1%. Employment in Marion and Polk, the two counties composing the Salem MSA, also grew relatively quickly, increasing by 3.0%. Gilliam County had the largest job loss over the year, falling by 12.4%. Lake County (-5.7%) and Sherman County (-4.7%) also had relatively large job declines. Statewide, jobs fell by 0.2%.

Seasonally Adjusted, November 2024 - November 2025





(1) Civilian labor force includes employed and unemployed individuals 16 years and older by place of residence. Employed includes nonfarm payroll employment, self-employed, unpaid family workers, domestics, agriculture, and labor disputants. Unemployment rate is calculated by dividing unemployed by civilian labor force. Data are not seasonally adjusted unless otherwise noted.

(2) The Bend metropolitan area includes Crook, Deschutes, and Jefferson counties.

(3) The Portland-Vancouver-Hillsboro metropolitan area includes Clackamas, Columbia, Multnomah, Washington, and Yamhill counties in Oregon, and Clark and Skamania counties in Washington State.
