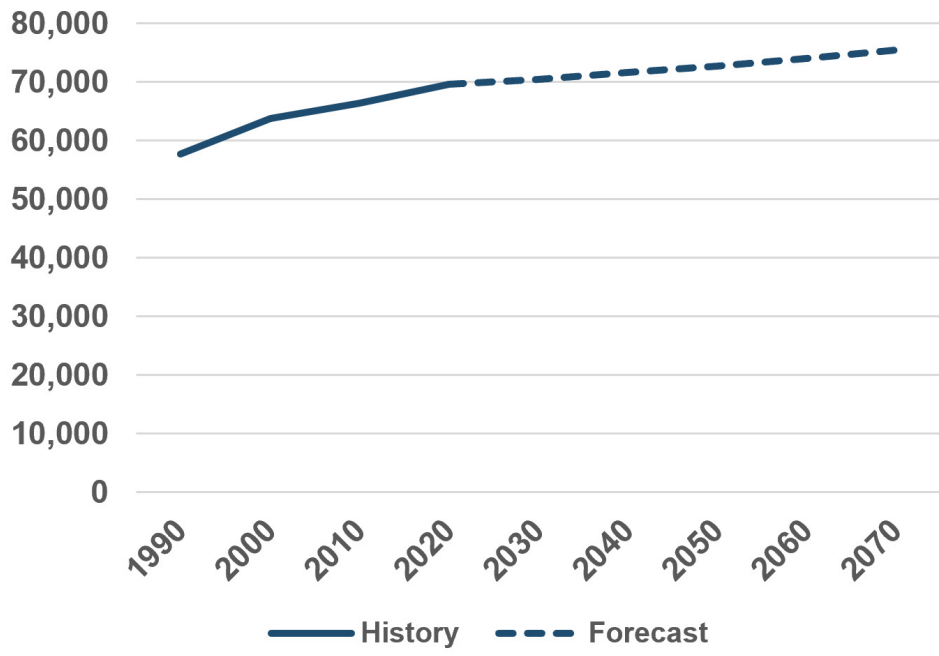


Special Topic: Population History & Forecasts



Klamath County's population in 1990 was 57,702. Thirty years later it had grown to 69,630, an increase of 20.7%.

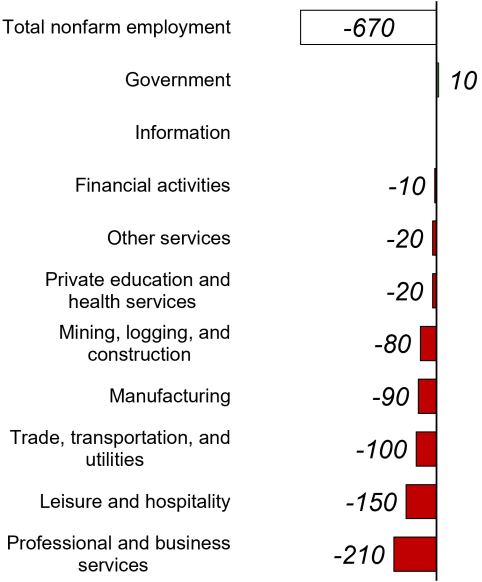
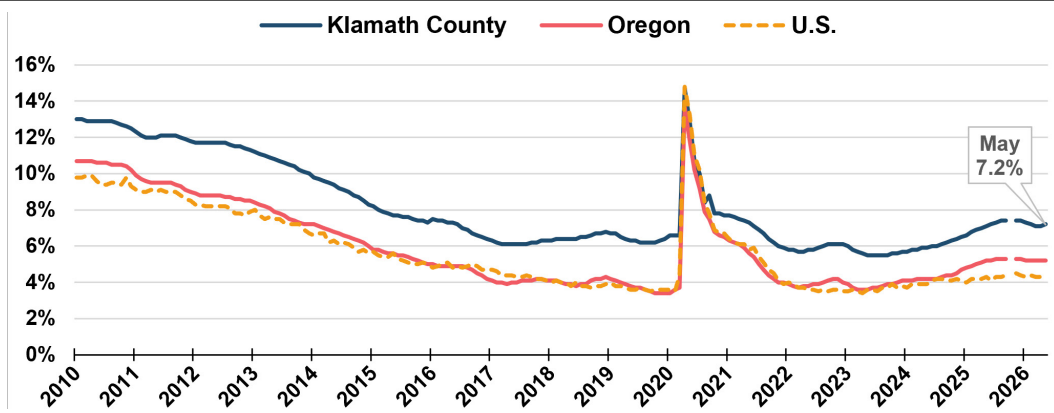
The county's population is projected to increase slowly through 2070 adding over 1,000 residents each decade. By 2070 it's expected that 75,434 people will live in Klamath County adding 5,804 (8.3%) from 2020 to 2070.

Unemployment Rate - 7.2%

- The unemployment rate in May 2025 was 7.1%
- The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate has ranged from 7.2% to 7.4% over the year

Local Area Unemployment

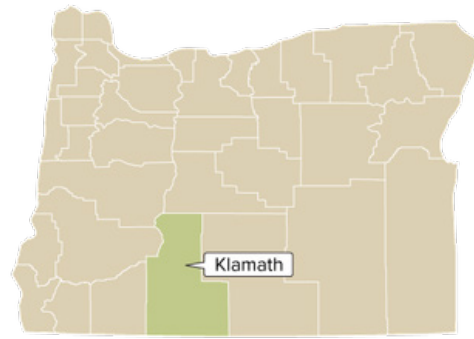


Industry Employment Change May 2025 to May 2026

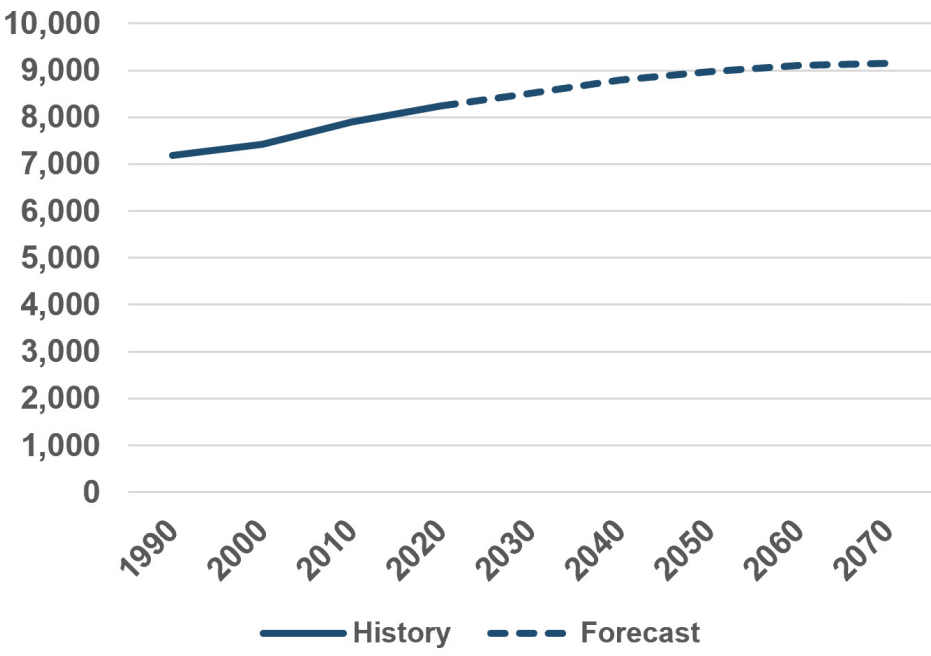
- Klamath County lost 670 jobs over the year
- Payroll employment down 2.8% over the year

Lake County's population in 1990 was 7,186. Thirty years later it had grown to 8,240, an increase of 14.7%.

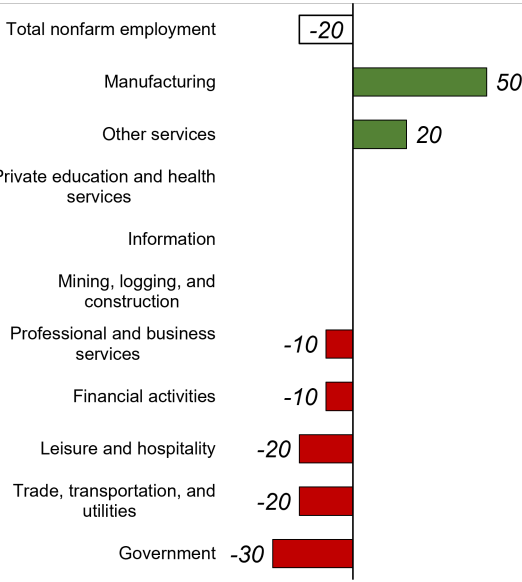
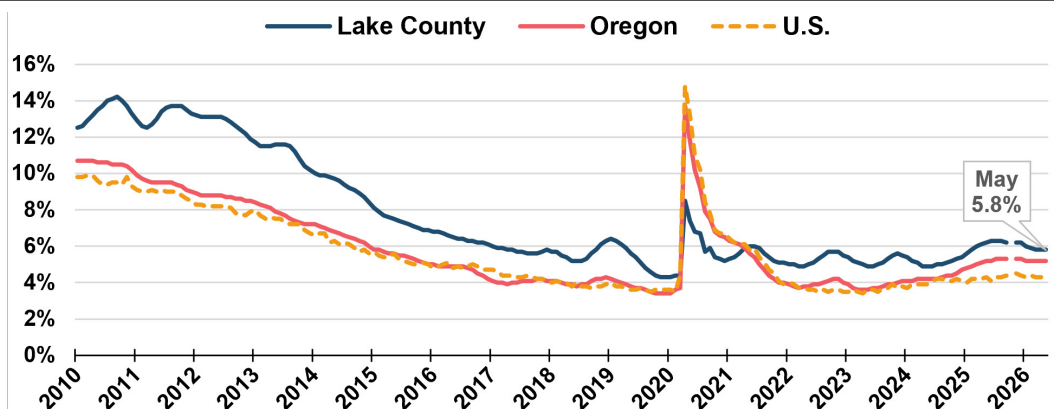
The county's population is projected to increase slowly through 2070 adding nearly 200 residents each decade. By 2070 it's expected that 9,149 people will live in Lake County adding 909 (11%) from 2020 to 2070.

Unemployment Rate - 5.8%

- The unemployment rate in May 2025 was 6.2%
- The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate has ranged from 5.8% to 6.3% over the year

Industry Employment Change May 2025 to May 2026

- Lake County lost 20 jobs over the year
- Payroll employment down 0.9% over the year
- Manufacturing added 70 jobs
- Government lost 110 jobs
