

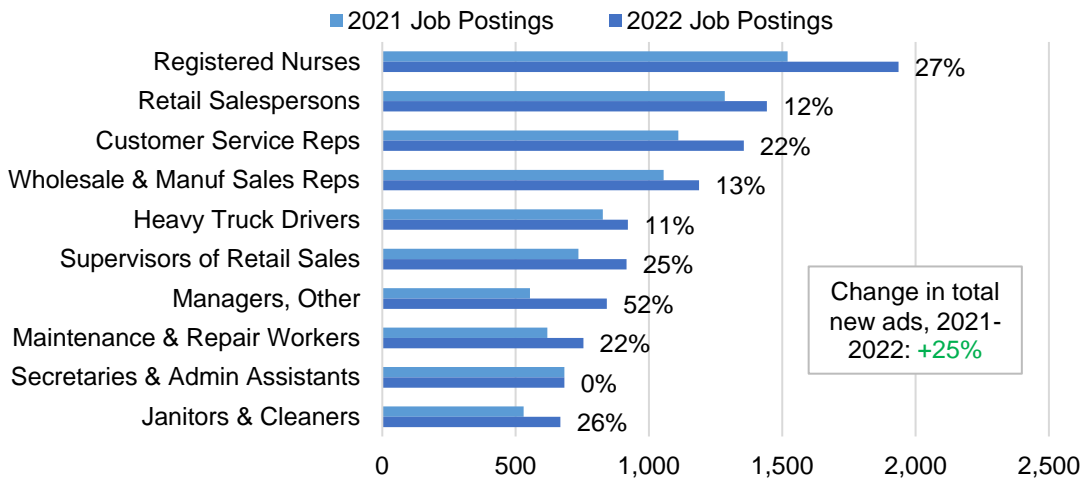
# LANE COUNTY ECONOMIC INDICATORS

**Graph of the Month:** Judging by online ads, job demand was higher in Lane County this year than last. Overall there were 25% more ads for jobs online in the last 12 months than the preceding 12, with larger growth in RN, janitor, and certain types of manager postings.
