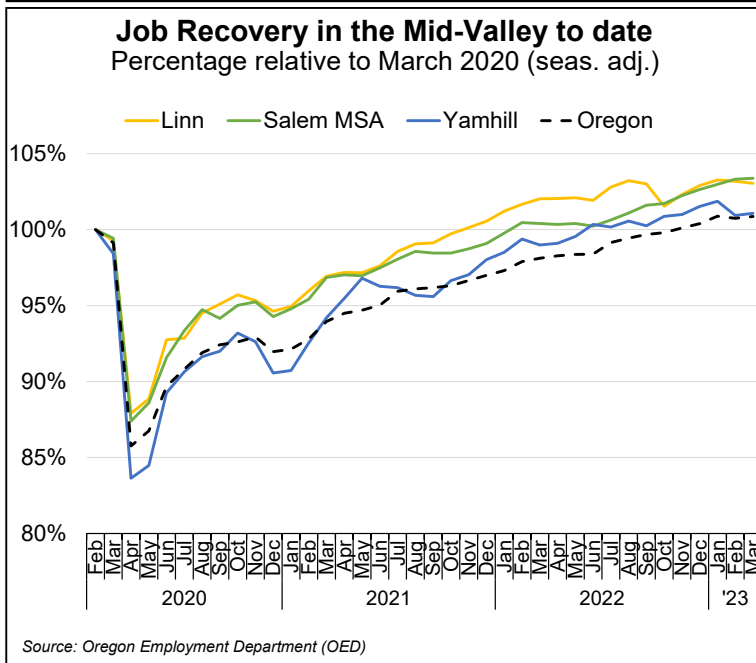
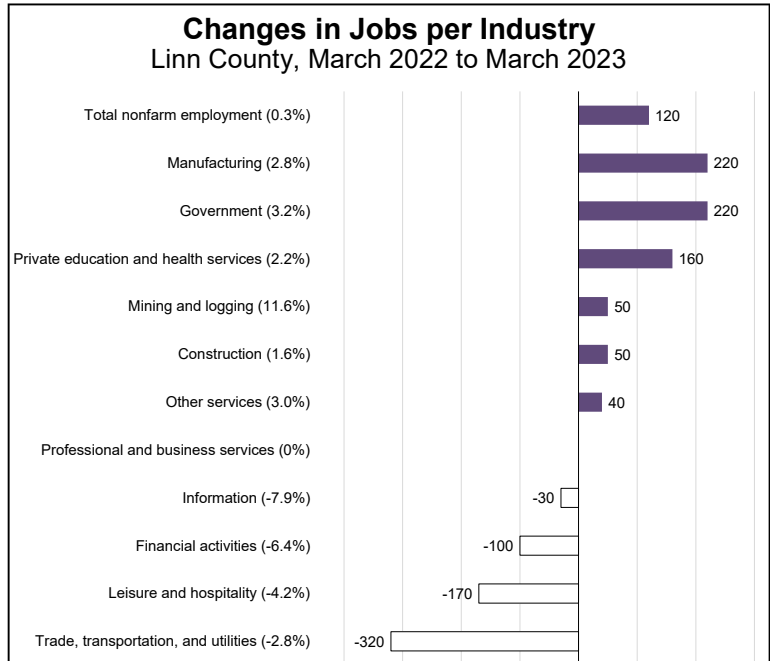
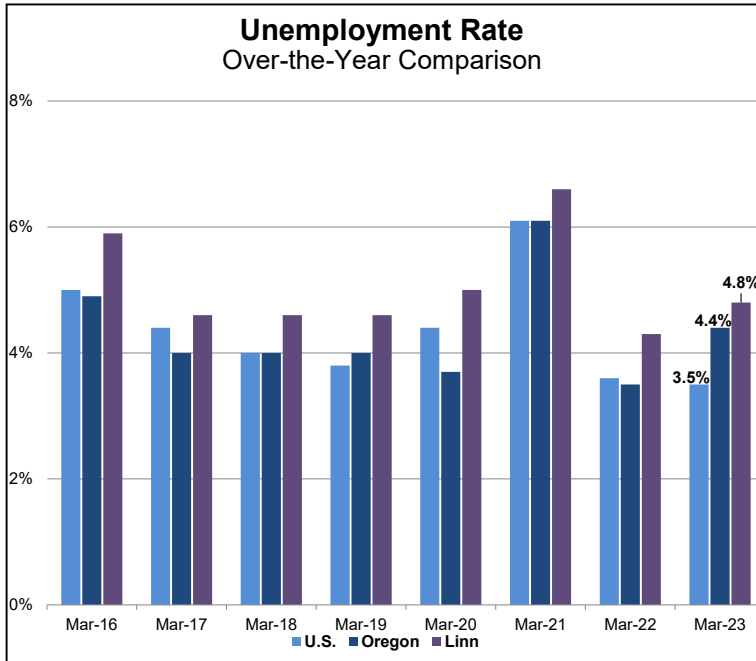


Mid-Valley Economic Indicators— Linn County, March Data

Linn County's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate decreased from a revised rate of 5.1% in February to 4.8% in March. The statewide unemployment rate also decreased and is now 4.4%. Between February and March, seasonally adjusted employment decreased by 60 jobs, and employment is now 1,430 jobs or 3.1% above the February 2020 pre-pandemic employment level.

From March of last year to March of this year, total nonfarm employment grew by 0.3%, or by 120 jobs. The manufacturing industry had the largest employment gains over the year (+220 jobs), followed by the public sector (+220 jobs). The trade, transportation, and utilities industry had the greatest employment losses (-320 jobs) during this time, followed by the leisure and hospitality industry (-170 jobs). The professional and business services industry remained relatively unchanged.

HIGHEST & LOWEST PAID OCCUPATION GROUPS — In 2022, in the Mid-Valley, management occupations paid the highest median hourly wage (\$46.88), followed by legal occupations (\$40.16), and computer and mathematical occupations (\$39.74). Farming, fishing, and forestry occupations, on the other hand, paid the lowest median hourly wage (\$14.58) of any occupation group. This was followed by food preparation and serving related occupations (\$14.92), and sales and related occupations (\$15.12).

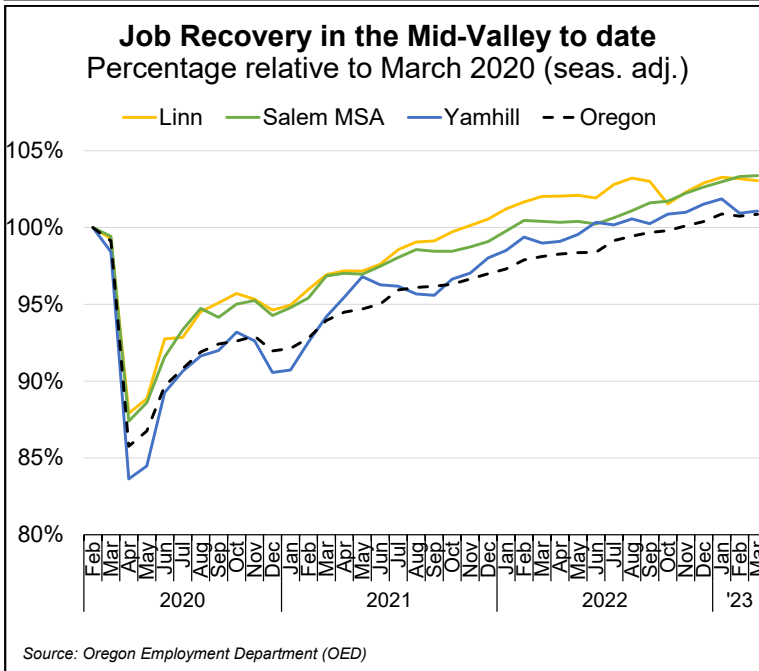
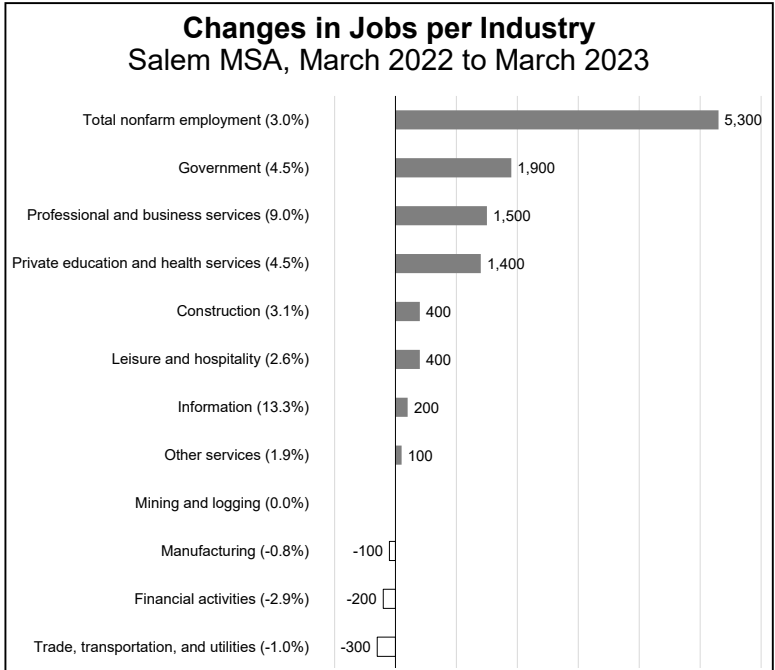
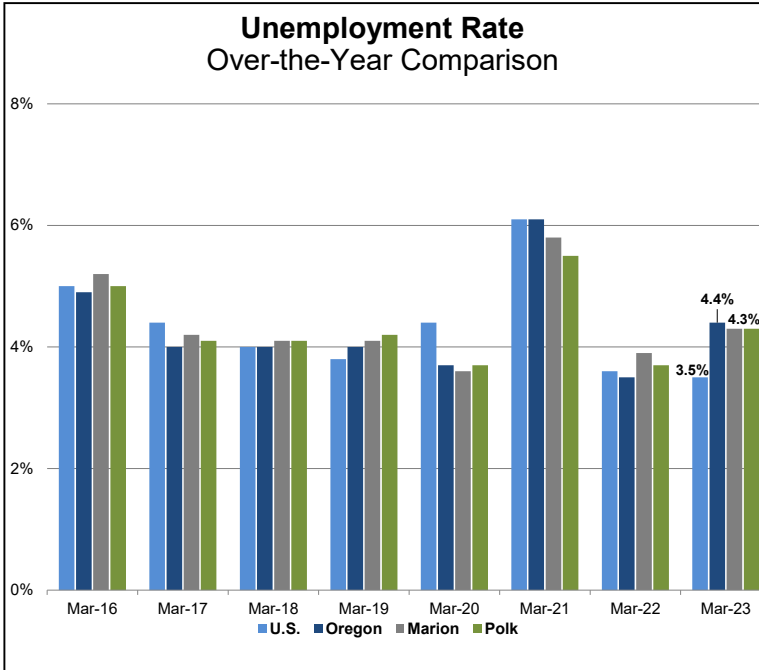

Mid-Valley Economic Indicators— Salem MSA, March Data

The Salem MSA's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate decreased for the first time in 8 months this past March, and is now 4.4%. The statewide unemployment rate also decreased to 4.4% during this time. Seasonally adjusted employment in the Salem MSA increased by 100 jobs in March and employment is now 3.4% or 5,900 jobs above the February 2020 pre-pandemic employment level.

Year-over-year, total nonfarm employment was up 3.0%, or 5,300 jobs. During this time, public-sector employment saw the largest gains (+1,900 jobs), followed by the professional and business services industry (+1,500 jobs). In contrast, employment in the trade, transportation, and utilities industry had the largest losses (-300 jobs), followed by the financial activities industry (-200 jobs) and the manufacturing industry (-100 jobs). The mining and logging industry remained relatively unchanged.

HIGHEST & LOWEST PAID OCCUPATION GROUPS — In 2022, in the Mid-Valley, management occupations paid the highest median hourly wage (\$46.88), followed by legal occupations (\$40.16), and computer and mathematical occupations (\$39.74). Farming, fishing, and forestry occupations, on the other hand, paid the lowest median hourly wage (\$14.58) of any occupation group. This was followed by food preparation and serving related occupations (\$14.92), and sales and related occupations (\$15.12).

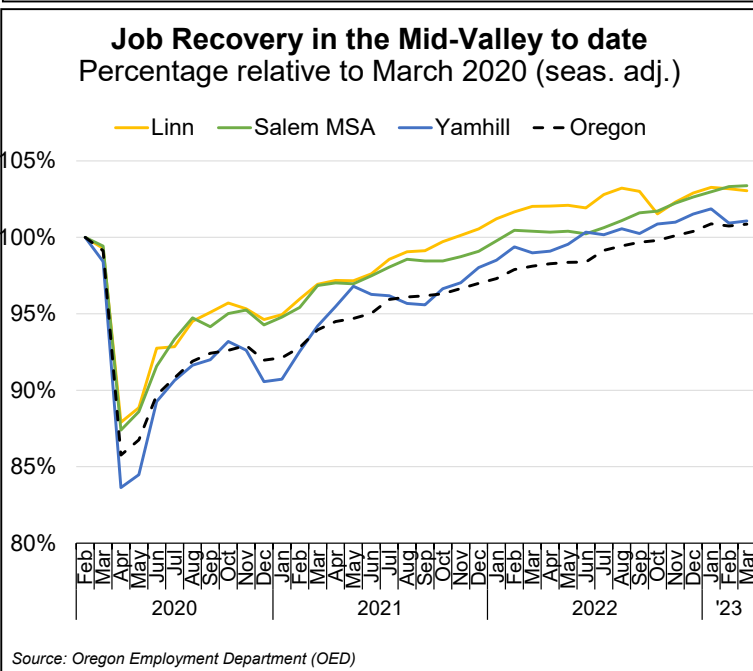
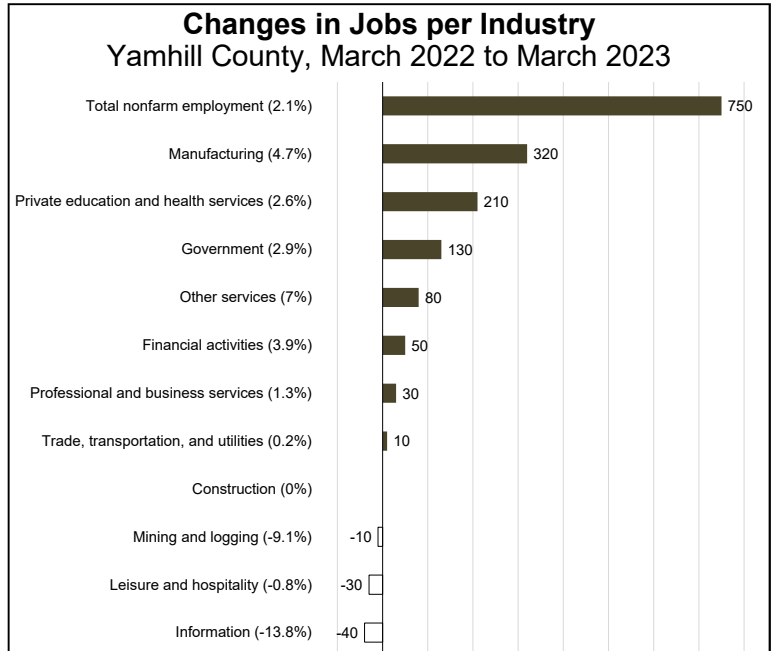
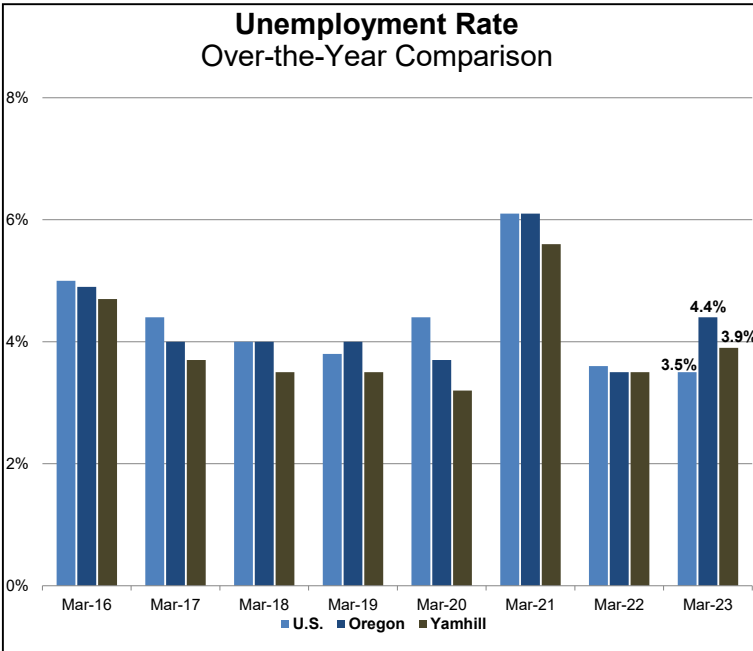

Mid-Valley Economic Indicators— Yamhill County, March Data

Yamhill County's seasonally adjusted unemployment crept downward from February to March of this year and is now 3.9%. In comparison, Oregon's statewide unemployment rate declined slightly to 4.4%. Seasonally adjusted employment increased by 50 jobs during this time, and employment is now 380 jobs, or 1.1%, above the pre-pandemic employment level of February 2020.

Year-over-year, total nonfarm employment increased by 2.1% or 750 jobs. The manufacturing industry gained the most jobs during this time (+320), followed by the private education and health services industry (+210 jobs). The information industry registered the most employment losses (-40 jobs), followed by the leisure and hospitality industry (-30 jobs). The construction industry saw little to no change over this time.

HIGHEST & LOWEST PAID OCCUPATION GROUPS — In 2022, in the Mid-Valley, management occupations paid the highest median hourly wage (\$46.88), followed by legal occupations (\$40.16), and computer and mathematical occupations (\$39.74). Farming, fishing, and forestry occupations, on the other hand, paid the lowest median hourly wage (\$14.58) of any occupation group. This was followed by food preparation and serving related occupations (\$14.92), and sales and related occupations (\$15.12). In comparison, the Mid-Valley median wage for all occupations was \$22.37 an hour.
