This month we are comparing multiple jobholders in Oregon to the U.S. While Oregon has typically had a higher number of multiple jobholders than the U.S. average, 2022 saw a reversal of that trend. 
Key Takeaways

Unemployment rates decreased across the region in March, though they remain higher than they were in March 2022. Industry gains and losses continue to be a mixed bag, with leisure and hospitality gaining jobs in Clatsop County while losing jobs in Columbia, Lincoln, and Tillamook counties. However, one area that is less of a mixed bag is seasonally adjusted nonfarm employment as a whole. Every county in the region, except Columbia, added jobs in March.


