


## Statewide and Local Unemployment Rates (Seasonally adjusted)


### Graph of the Month: Percentage of Workers Who Work From Home


According to the American Community Survey, the percentage of Oregonians who worked from home increased from 7.3% in 2019 to 22.7% in 2021. This was a 15.4 percentage point increase from prior to the pandemic. Jackson and Josephine counties saw similar spikes in number of remote workers with Jackson County increasing by 10,204 and Josephine increasing by 1,539 from 2019 to 2021.
