



To better understand the workers that are in demand, we can turn to Help Wanted OnLine ads (HWOL). HWOL measures real-time labor demand captured through online job postings.


Pictured to the left are the occupations with the most hiring demand in the last 60 days for Medford (from February 27—April 27). The number next to each bar represents how many jobs were posted for that occupation.

There were 2,808 non-duplicated jobs posted during the 60 day period. Health care occupations are currently in high demand, four of the top 10 occupations were health care related jobs. The number one occupation was a registered nurse which appeared in 551 postings.


