



Graph of the Month:Selected Industry Employment Projections, 2020-2030



According to projections from the Oregon Employment Department, Oregon's total employment is expected to grow by 16% or 317,600 jobs between 2020 and 2030 while the South Coast is anticipating 10% growth or 7,380 jobs to be added. Private educational and health services is expecting to add 1,350 jobs, the second most in all of the published industries. Food services and drinking places was at the top of the growth list with 23% change from 2020 to 2030, or 1,080 added jobs, as the sector recovers from job losses during the pandemic.



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
