



Graph of the Month: All incorporated cities in Washington County have seen net job gains since the pandemic recession in Spring 2020.

- From the pandemic job losses in early spring of 2020 to January 2024, the growth rate in resident employment within Washington County cities has ranged from 13% to 17%.
- The urban cities of Hillsboro, Beaverton, and Tigard provided over four-fifths of the job growth for residents living in Washington County during 2020-2024.

Unemployment in Washington County Lower than MSA January 2000 to January 2024, seasonally adjusted


