

Help Wanted in Oregon: Results from the 2022 Oregon Job Vacancy Survey



Oregon had roughly 104,000 job vacancies at any given time in 2022.

We surveyed 16,000 private employers with two or more employees. If they were hiring, employers gave details about each vacancy, including:

- Job title
- Full- or part-time status
- Permanent or temporary status
- Starting wage or salary
- Educational and experience requirements

Businesses also identified if their vacancies were difficult to fill, and if so, they wrote in the primary reason they faced hiring challenges.



Hiring in 2022 outpaced hiring prior to the pandemic.

The number of Oregon job vacancies reached record levels in 2022, as the economy recovered from the pandemic recession in 2020. In another record, employers reported about seven out of 10 openings were difficult to fill in 2022.

Other characteristics Oregon employers are looking for didn't change much during the pandemic recession and recovery. A typical job vacancy tends to be for a fulltime, permanent position. About one-third require education beyond high school and half require previous experience.



More than one-third (36%) of vacancies in 2022 had been open for 60 days or longer – about the same as in 2021 (35%). Almost all of these vacancies were reported as difficult to fill.




Oregon Job Vacancies by Education Requirement, 2022






Average hourly wages increase along with education requirements for job vacancies...
