

Help Wanted in Portland

Results from the 2021 **Job Vacancy Survey**



Portland Metro had roughly 28,000 job vacancies at any given time in 2021.

We surveyed 1,600 private employers with two or more employees.

If they were hiring, employers gave details about each vacancy, including:

- Job title
- Full- or part-time status
- Permanent or temporary status
- Starting wage or salary
- Education and experience requirements

Businesses also identified if their vacancies were difficult to fill, and if so, they wrote in the primary reason they faced hiring challenges.



Across Oregon, businesses reported roughly 97,000 vacancies at any given time in 2021.



The number of vacancies reached record levels in 2021, as the economy recovered from the pandemic recession in 2020. In another record, employers reported about seven out of 10 openings were difficult to fill in 2021.

Other characteristics Oregon employers are looking for didn't change much during the pandemic recession and recovery. A typical job vacancy tends to be for a full-time, permanent position. About one-third require education beyond high school and half require previous experience.



The number of Portland Metro vacancies was higher in 2021 than at any time in the survey's history since 2015.





One-third (33%) of vacancies in 2021 had been open for 60 days or longer – up from 20% in 2019. Almost all of these vacancies were reported as difficult to fill.




Portland Metro Job Vacancies by Education Requirement, 2021





Average hourly wages increase along with education requirements for job vacancies...


Average Hourly Wage for Portland Metro Job Vacancies by Education Requirement, 2021





...and high-paying vacancies are more likely to require education beyond high school.


Share of Portland Metro Job Vacancies Requiring Education Beyond High School by Hourly Wage Range, 2021

The share of vacancies paying \$25 per hour or more almost doubled in 2021, up from 10% in 2020.


Vacancies requiring higher education are more likely to be highpaying, permanent, and require prior experience.



Employers had the most difficulty filling their higherwage vacancies, with more than 80% of jobs starting above \$20 per hour reported as difficult.
