

Help Wanted in Southwestern Oregon

Results from the 2021 **Job Vacancy Survey**



Southwestern Oregon had roughly 4,800 job vacancies at any given time in 2021.

We surveyed 1,300 private employers with two or more employees.

If they were hiring, employers gave details about each vacancy, including:

- Job title
- Full- or part-time status
- Permanent or temporary status
- Starting wage or salary
- Educational and experience requirements

Businesses also identified if their vacancies were difficult to fill, and if so, they wrote in the primary reason they faced hiring challenges.



Across Oregon, businesses reported roughly 97,000 vacancies at any given time in 2021.



The number of vacancies reached record levels in 2021, as the economy recovered from the pandemic recession in 2020. In another record, employers reported about seven out of 10 openings were difficult to fill in 2021.

Other characteristics Oregon employers are looking for didn't change much during the pandemic recession and recovery. A typical job vacancy tends to be for a full-time, permanent position. About one-third require education beyond high school and half require previous experience.



The number of Southwestern Oregon vacancies was higher in 2021 than at any time in the survey's history since 2015.





More vacancies in 2021 had been open for 60 days or longer, accounting for 29% – up from 24% in 2019. Almost all of these vacancies were reported as difficult to fill.



Most (82%) Southwestern Oregon job vacancies required no education beyond high school.


Southwestern Oregon Job Vacancies by Education Requirement, 2021





Average hourly wages generally increase along with education requirements for job vacancies...


Average Hourly Wage for Southwestern Oregon Job Vacancies by Education Requirement, 2021





...and high-paying vacancies are far more likely to require education beyond high school.


Share of Southwestern Oregon Job Vacancies Requiring Education Beyond High School by Hourly Wage Range, 2021

Employers had the most difficulty filling their higher-wage vacancies, with nine out of 10 jobs starting at \$20 per hour or more reported as difficult.
