## **OREGON BUSINESSES REPORTED 65,200 VACANCIES IN** FALL 2023.

Oregon businesses reported 65,200 vacancies in fall 2023. Vacancies decreased 8% from the summer and decreased 24% from fall 2022. Employers reported difficulty filling 63% of fall 2023 vacancies.


The average starting wage among this group of vacancies was around \$25.62 per hour, an inflationadjusted increase of 3% from fall 2022 and a 7% increase from summer 2023.

Characteristics of Oregon job vacancies were consistent with prior quarters. A typical job vacancy tends to be for a full-time, permanent position.





## **AS UNEMPLOYMENT AND VACANCIES DROPPED IN THE FALL, THE UNEMPLOYED TO JOB VACANCY RATIO IN OREGON REMAINED FLAT.**



Oregon's unemployed-to-vacancy ratio has been below pre-pandemic levels for the past two years.

The U.S. ratio was 0.7 in October 2023, its tenth straight quarter below 1. It reached 4.3 in April 2020 after several years around 1-to-1.

Oregon had 1.1 unemployed per job vacancy in fall 2023, still much lower than the peak of 5.7 in May 2020.

Health care and social assistance had the most vacancies of any industry, with 20,500. Construction had 6,400 vacancies. Leisure and hospitality had 6,200 vacancies in fall.



The average starting wage among this group of vacancies was around \$25.62 per hour, an inflation-adjusted increase of 3% from fall 2022, and a 7% increase from summer 2023.

The number of vacancies offering a starting wage below \$20 per hour decreased 52% over the year. The number of vacancies offering between \$20 and \$30 per hour increased 4%, and vacancies paying above \$30 per hour decreased 16%.

Fall vacancies were distributed across the state, with the Portland tri-county area accounting for about 40%.

Vacancies decreased over the year in every region of the state, except the East Cascades which increased 34%.
