

## Help Wanted in Oregon

Results from the Spring 2022 Job Vacancy Survey



## Oregon businesses reported 106,500 vacancies in spring 2022.

Difficult to Fill

Requiring Previous Experience

Vacancies increased 6% from the winter and increased 9% from spring 2021. Employers reported difficulty filling 77% of spring 2022 vacancies.


The average starting wage among this group of vacancies was \$21.36 per hour, an inflation-adjusted increase of 7.0% from spring 2021 and 4.4% increase from winter 2022.

Characteristics of Oregon job vacancies were consistent with prior quarters. A typical job vacancy tends to be for a full-time, permanent position.



# As unemployment dropped and vacancies rose, the unemployed to job vacancy ratio declined to record lows.







The unemployed-to-vacancy ratio dropped dramatically over the past year and a half.

The U.S. ratio was 0.5 in April 2022. It peaked very suddenly amid COVID closures, reaching 4.3 in April 2020 after several years around 1-to-1.

Oregon had 0.7 unemployed per job vacancy in April 2022 after reaching 5.8 in May 2020.

Leisure and hospitality had the most job vacancies so far in 2022. The spring level was 21% above spring 2021. Health care and social assistance had the second highest level of vacancies in the spring, with the total 8% lower than at this time last year.

Note: While we've all seen evidence of local school districts hiring as inperson learning fully resumed, those openings and other government hiring aren't captured in this survey of private-sector businesses.



# The starting wage for job vacancies averaged \$21.36 per hour in the spring.


The average starting wage among this group of vacancies was around \$21.36 per hour, an inflation-adjusted increase of 7.0% from spring 2021 and 4.4% increase from winter 2022.

Total vacancies were up 9% from the level last spring. The number of vacancies offering a starting wage below \$15 per hour dropped 40% over the year. The number of vacancies offering between \$15 and \$25 per hour increased 35% and vacancies paying above \$25 per hour increased 56%.



## 77% of spring job vacancies were reported as difficult to fill.

## Businesses Report Difficulty Filling 77% of Vacancies in Spring 2022



The occupations with the highest number of difficult-to-fill vacancies:

- Cooks, restaurants (4,400)
- Personal care aides (3,100)
- Maids and housekeeping cleaners (2,700)
- Retail salespersons (2,700)
- Dishwashers (2,600)

Vacancies increased 6% from the winter and increased 9% from spring 2021.

The Portland tri-county area represented 38% of spring vacancies. Vacancies increased the most over the year in the Mid-Valley and Lane County.
