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Employment in Morrow & Umatilla Counties: February 2024

Unemployment Rates Hold Steady in February

Umatilla County's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate held steady at 3.8% in February. Ranked among Oregon's 36 counties, Umatilla County placed eighth, tied with Deschutes and Yamhill counties. Over the year, Umatilla County's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate fell by 1.7 percentage points.

Umatilla County's nonfarm employment total rose to 30,250 in February, a gain of 230 jobs. Private industry added 180 jobs in February, climbing to 22,510, and government added 50, rising to 7,740. Mining, logging, and construction increased its total in February, climbing to 1,380, a gain of 50. Manufacturing and transportation, warehousing, and utilities each added 40 jobs rising to 2,560 and 2,500, respectively. Private jobs losses were confined to information and professional and business services, each cutting 10 jobs. In the public sector, local education rose by 30 jobs, climbing to 2,710, other local government added 10, and state government lost 10.

Umatilla County's total private industry employment rose by 710 jobs over the year ending in February (+3.3%). Professional and business services led private-industry growth, rising by 380 jobs thanks in part to a non-economic code change (a correction or reclassification in our administrative records). Transportation, warehousing, and utilities increased its total by 150 jobs (+6.4%), and private education and health services rose by 90 (+2.2%). Retail trade cut 40 jobs over the year and other services lost 20. Government employment increased by 30 jobs over the year, led by a gain of 50 in Indian tribal. Other local government rose by 20 jobs, state government increased its total by 10, federal government added 10, and local education cut 60.

Morrow County's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate rose slightly by 0.1 percentage point in February to 3.5%, ranking fourth among Oregon counties, tied with Washington County. Over the year, Morrow County's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate fell by 1.0 percentage point.

Morrow County's nonfarm employment rose to 5,690 in February, a gain of 40 jobs. Private industry increased its total to 4,570 in February, a gain of 30, while government added 10, rising to 1,120. Transportation, warehousing, and utilities rose by 20 jobs in February to reach 440. Leisure and hospitality (+10) also added jobs. Construction was the only private industry to cut jobs in February, dropping 10. In the public sector, local government added 20 jobs and federal government cut 10.

Morrow County's private-industry employment rose by 130 jobs over the year ending in February (+2.9%). Private industry's over-the-year growth was led by manufacturing (+50), professional and business services (+30), and construction (+20). Losses were confined to mining and logging (-10) and private education and health services (-10). Local government rose by 60 jobs over the year while federal government and state government held steady.

The Oregon Employment Department plans to release the March county and metropolitan area unemployment rates on Tuesday, April 23, and the statewide unemployment rate and employment survey data for March on Wednesday, April 17.

The Oregon Employment Department and the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) work cooperatively to develop and publish monthly payroll employment and labor force data for Oregon's metropolitan areas and counties. The estimates of monthly job gains and losses are based on a survey of businesses. The estimates of unemployment are based on a survey of households and other sources.

The Oregon Employment Department payroll employment estimates are revised quarterly using information from unemployment insurance tax records. All department publications use data from this *official Oregon series* unless noted.

The department also makes the BLS-produced nonfarm payroll employment series for metropolitan areas available. These are revised annually by BLS.
